PASTOR'S COLUMN

Dear Parishioners:

This week, we celebrate the feast of the Baptism of the Lord, and with that, the Christmas season comes to an end. The next season, it seems, must be flu season! I hope all of you will stay healthy during this time.

This month of January will see some projects take place in church. I spoke briefly about these previously, but want to remind you of them once again. Beginning January 16, the pipe organ will be out of commission. It will be sealed up to protect it from infiltration of dust while the church interior is cleaned professionally during the week of January 21-25. The church cleaning will involve the removal of some pews to allow for special equipment for the cleaning of the walls and ceilings. Once the church is cleaned, the pews will be replaced. We hope that this process will be completed so that everything is back in place for the following weekend. The organ, however, will not be in service until sometime in March. Once the church cleaning is finished, the organ will be dismantled, and all the pipes and other parts thoroughly cleaned and finally reassembled. It may take some time to get the organ in reliable working order and stable tuning after the cleaning is complete. So the organ will be completely out of commission for approximately two months. We will have to make up for the absence of the organ by a fuller use of our voices to sing God's praises!

Finally, I want to give you all some advance notice of our upcoming Parish Mission. Fr. Thomas Blau, O.P., will be the Mission Director. The Parish Mission is an opportunity for spiritual renewal. Mark your calendars for March 10-13. This is when the Mission will take place. More details will be given in the coming weeks.


