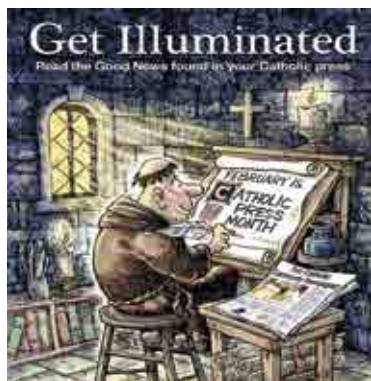

To be considered for Tuition Assistance:

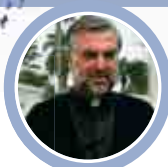
1. You must apply online at www.factstuitionaid.com and the completed application must be submitted by March 15. The required supporting documentation must be postmarked by March 15. Verification of application must be completed within 14 days from application submission. (Please file early in case additional documentation is requested by FACTS.)
2. Payment of the **\$35.00** application fee must accompany the application.
3. Only one application per family is required.
4. **Required documents** are current year W2 (2018) and previous year Federal Tax Return (2017) or if you *do not* receive a W2 then previous year (2017) & current year (2018) Federal Tax Returns are required. These must be submitted at the time of application. **Failure to do so will affect your eligibility for assistance from both the Diocese and St. Andrew Parish.**

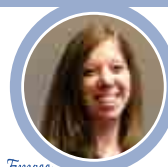
