PASTOR'S COLUMN

Dear Parishioners:

This week will be a very eventful week in the Diocese of Columbus. Bishop Robert J. Brennan will be installed as the twelfth Bishop of Columbus on Friday, March 29. The installation Mass takes place at 2:00 p.m. at St. Joseph Cathedral. The installation is symbolized by the Bishop taking his seat on the "cathedra" or chair, thus symbolically taking possession of the Diocese. The ceremony is conducted by the Metropolitan Archbishop, in the presence of the Papal Nuncio. Also, as part of the ceremony, the Chancellor and the College of Consultors of the Diocese inspect the Papal Bull, the document by which the Holy Father appoints the Bishop. The installation is a momentous event, attended by bishops, priests, deacons, public dignitaries, and representatives of all the parishes throughout the diocese of Columbus. In addition, on the eve of the installation, there is a Solemn Vespers celebration in the Cathedral. Clergy, religious, diocesan staff and parish representatives will attend this event. St. Andrew Parish will be represented at these events by four parishioners. Each parish received only four "spaces" at these events, because of the limited capacity of the Cathedral. I am grateful to those St. Andrew parishioners who will be attending and representing our parish at the installation events. All this made me recall the year 1973. That summer, Bishop Edward J. Herrmann was installed as Bishop of Columbus. I was 17 years old, and I was chosen to represent my home parish of Our Lady of Lourdes in Ada at the Installation Mass. It was the first time I ever was in the Cathedral. I came with my pastor, Rev. Richard Endres, and the other parish representative who was our parish council president. We did not get seats, and I stood in the back of the church. There was a banquet at the Neil House afterward. But it was an unforgettable event that made a lasting impression on me.

Please note also that, because of the joyous occasion of the installation of Bishop Brennan on March 29, a dispensation has been given from abstinence from meat on what would normally be a Lenten Friday of abstinence.

Let us pray for Bishop Brennan and for the Diocese of Columbus!



Lenten Reflections on Mercy and Forgiveness

Week 3

READINGS: *Exodus 3:1–8a, 13–15; 1 Corinthians 10:1–6, 10–12; Luke 13:1–9*

We must work toward our salvation

Not forgiving someone is like drinking poison and expecting the other person to die. Holding a grudge against those who have wronged you only destroys you on the inside. It does nothing to create peace.

That's why Jesus said, "Blessed are the peacemakers, / for they will be called

sons of God" (Mt 5:9). God's mercy is given as a reward for those who pursue it with diligence. We must work to cultivate peace if we desire to see it flourish in our families, communities, nations, and especially within our own selves.

In today's Gospel reading, we see how this truth is manifested in the fig tree.




"Sir, leave it for this year also, and I shall cultivate the ground around it and fertilize it" (Lk 13:8).

It was surrounded by the untilled and unproductive soil, much like those who withhold forgiveness are surrounded by unrest, anxiety, and spiritual inactivity. We feel worthless in such a state, and as such we risk being unproductive, unhealthy, and ultimately destroyed.

However, the good farmer, here representing God, provides us with hope. He tills our soil and fertilizes our souls with mercy. His forgiveness gives us another chance for spiritual survival, but only if we are able to bear good fruit as a result. Our good fruit, then, is the mercy we show to others, which leads us to being known as the true sons and daughters of the God of peace.

For Reflection

- Has God tilled the landscape of your soul so that it can bear fruit abundantly?
- Have you helped him weed out the vices that keep your soul from thriving as it should?
- Have you helped others by tending to their spiritual growth in service to them?





Prayer and work

Benedict was a man of silence and constant reflection. He was also a man who knew how to work! He helped form the Benedictines, a Catholic religious order whose motto is *ora et labora* ("pray and work"). Benedict knew that in order to show God how much he loved him, he would need to work diligently in both his prayer life as well as through manual labor. He understood St. Paul's words that we must "pray without ceasing" (1 Thes 5:17) and "work quietly" (2 Thes 3:12). Indeed, St. Benedict was given God's reward of mercy for having persevered in prayer and for acquiring a work ethic that was marked by the spiritual worth of every one of his daily tasks.


