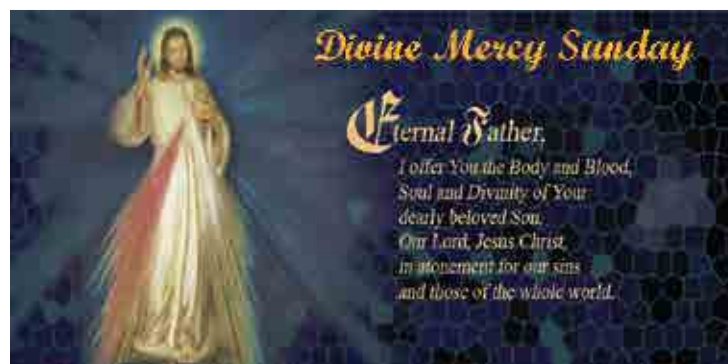

PASTOR'S COLUMN

Dear Parishioners:

During these days of Easter I have been reflecting on the Church as the Body of Christ. The Body of Christ is One, and there are many members. These members, scattered all over the world, are nevertheless united to one another in the one Body of Christ, the Universal Church. Because of this communion, this oneness that exists among all the members of the Universal Church, we are not indifferent or unconcerned about the fortunes and misfortunes of our brothers and sisters in Christ throughout the world. As St. Paul tells us, "If one part suffers, all the parts suffer with it; if one part is honored, all the parts share its joy." (1 Cor. 12:26)

The truth of this saying is very evident in recent days. St. Andrew Parish was honored to have Bishop Campbell with us. Also, St. Andrew is hosting the Miter Society Mass and Dinner this Sunday, April 28, and Bishop Robert Brennan will be here for that. We are honored to welcome Bishop Brennan to St. Andrew Parish.
