PASTOR'S COLUMN

Dear Parishioners:

This weekend marks the Fifth Sunday of Lent, and the final phase of the holy season, which is known as "Passiontide." During the season of Passiontide, while we continue our Lenten practices and sacrifices, we also turn our attention and devotion toward the cross of Christ. We remember with sorrow our Lord: betrayed, His crucifixion, His suffering and death. In this season, I would like to recommend to you two devotions to enhance your prayer. The first is the Stations of the Cross. There is no better way to meditate on the Lord's suffering and death, but which He made atonement for all our sins and reconciled us to God than by following the Way of the Cross. We can pray the fourteen Stations of the Cross in several ways. We can participate in the communal celebration on Friday evening here in Church; we can make the Way of the Cross on our own by quietly pausing and praying before each station during a visit to the Church. In St. Andrew Church, the 14 Stations are marked by the 14 stained glass windows on the west side of the Church. The 14 Stations are also found in an outdoor setting along the sidewalk south of the Church along Reed Road. The Stations can also be prayed anywhere it is convenient. When we pray the Stations, we strive to accompany Christ as He makes His way to Calvary, and we acclaim Him, "We adore you, O Christ, and we praise you, because by your holy cross, you have saved the world."

The other devotion I want to recommend to you during this time is the "Prayer before the Crucifix." This is a favorite of mine, which I have always used as part of my thanksgiving after receiving Holy Communion, ever since I made my First Communion. I learned this prayer from my First Communion prayer book. If you do not know it, you can find it in our hymnal in the pews on page 894. It is a beautiful prayer that asks Jesus to fill us with faith, hope and charity and a true sorrow for our sins as we tenderly contemplate His wounds. I invite you to discover the richness of this prayer during the Season of Passiontide.






In Christ, we form part of the union of his greater community known as the Communion of Saints. In this group we find great holy members of the Faith like
