PASTOR'S COLUMN

Dear Parishioners:

I want to make you aware of a scam that is going around. It involves email messages or text messages which appear to be sent by someone you know, and asking for money or gift cards or other valuables. Unsuspecting recipients of these messages may send the money or gift cards thinking they are helping the person they know, when in reality, they are being robbed, and they are sending their money to unscrupulous thieves impersonating someone they know and trust. I have been made aware that a number of people have received emails which appeared to be sent by me, asking for a favor, or for money or gift cards, or some other request. These messages are cleverly worded and might fool some people into thinking they were really from me. Numerous other priests in our diocese and elsewhere (and some bishops, too!) have had their identity misused in this way. Please do not fall for these scams! I would never ask for money or valuables in this way. I hope you do not blame those whose identity has been stolen if you are so unfortunate as to be fooled by one of these phony solicitations. If you should ever receive a message that appears to be from me, and you are uncertain about its authenticity, please contact me and ask me to verify it.

The following message from me is completely authentic, however, and I vouch for it! Our Bishop's Annual Appeal is off to a good start, as we have \$77,667 in pledges toward our goal of \$206,210. The Diocese of Columbus needs the full support of St. Andrew Parish, and Bishop Brennan is counting on our reaching our goal. If you have not yet made a pledge or gift to the BAA, please do so now, and help to carry on the good work of the Church in the Diocese of Columbus. Thank you for your support and generosity.

Finally, I want to announce that Deacon Frank Brown, a seminarian of the Diocese of Columbus who was ordained as a deacon on May 3, has been assigned to St. Andrew Parish for the summer months, and for weekends during the coming academic year. Please give Deacon Brown a warm welcome!

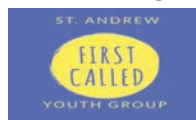

All Parishioners are invited to schedule an appointment for a preventive health, non-invasive and painless screening.

Five screenings will be offered that scan for potential health problems related to Blocked Arteries (leading cause of stroke), Abdominal Aortic Aneurysms (can lead to ruptured aorta), Hardening of the Arteries in the Legs (strong predictor of heart disease), Atrial Fibrillation (closely ties to stroke risk), Bone Density Screening (risk of osteoporosis). All five screenings take 60-90 minutes to complete.
