PASTOR'S COLUMN

Dear Parishioners:

Every Tuesday from 6:00 to 9:00 p.m., Eucharistic Adoration takes place in the Church. The Most Blessed Sacrament is exposed in the monstrance on the altar for our worship and Adoration. The time of Adoration closes with the celebration of Compline (night prayer) and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.

On many Tuesdays, I play the organ to accompany the hymns we sing for night prayers and Benediction. Often as I sit at the organ bench in the choir loft, I look into the mirror that is on the organ console and see the reflection of the Sacrament of the Lord's Body on the altar. Invariably, in that moment, I recall the words of St. Paul to the Corinthians, "At present we see indistinctly, as in a mirror, but then, face to face. (1 Cor. 13:12). I realize that Jesus Christ, our God and Saviour, is truly present, truly with us, hidden under the sign, the sacrament, of Bread. He fulfills his promise that He made to His disciples, "I am with you always, even to the end of the age." (Mt. 28:20). He is with us just as truly as He was with His disciples when He appeared to them after His Resurrection and He ate and drank with them. Yet we must discern that true and real presence with the eyes of faith, for we can see only dimly and indistinctly as in a mirror. As the hymn we sing at Benediction expresses it: "what our sense fail to fathom, let us grasp with faith's consent!" To see the Lord Himself sacramentally present, though my vision is indirect and obscured, only increases my longing to see Him face to face in the Kingdom of God! You, too, can experience the Lord's true and real presence and gaze upon Him with unveiled faces at Eucharistic Adoration, every Tuesday evening.

The month of May is quickly coming to an end! It is the time for new beginnings – the beginning of summer with the Memorial Day holiday, also graduations and weddings mark new beginnings. To all those making new beginnings in this season, I offer congratulations and best wishes! May God bless you all!

All Parishioners are invited to schedule an appointment for a preventive health, noninvasive and painless screening.

Five screenings will be offered that scan for potential health problems related to Blocked Arteries (leading cause of stroke), Abdominal Aortic Aneurysms (can lead to ruptured aorta), Hardening of the Arteries in the Legs (strong predictor of heart disease), Atrial Fibrillation (closely ties to stroke risk), Bone Density Screening (risk of osteoporosis). All five screenings take 60-90 minutes to complete.
