PASTOR'S COLUMN

Dear Parishioners:

Since Sunday is Father's Day and also the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, I thought I would share a brief meditation on God our Father. A few weeks ago, I presented a meditation on the "Our Father" to the monthly Men's Breakfast here at St. Andrew. The gist of my presentation was that, if we reverse the order of the petitions of the "Lord's Prayer," we progress to ever higher forms of prayer. I won't repeat my entire presentation, but I will share this brief portion.

Our Father! This is the summit, the fullness of the contemplation of God Himself. There is no longer any awareness of ourselves. Jesus reveals God to us. He knew God as "the Father" and "Abba," and taught us to address God as "Our Father." He teaches that He and the Father are one, and whoever sees Him sees the Father, for "the Father is in me and I am in the Father." When we say "Our Father," we are aware of ourselves as a child of God! "See what love the Father has shown us that we are called the children of God, yet that is what we are. What we shall later be has not yet been revealed, but we know that we shall be like him for we shall see Him as is" (Ct. 1 Jn. 3:1-2). When we say "Our Father," we place ourselves in the presence of the all loving God, who is mysterious, infinite, unfathomable. We are filled with wonder and awe. We are silent and speechless except for that word Jesus revealed to us that sums up all that God is: our Father.

May the blessing of almighty God, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, come down upon you all and remain with you forever!


