

PASTOR' CORNER

Dear Parishioners:

I have some important news to share with all of you, which has to do with the multiple roles I fulfill within the Diocese of Columbus. As you know, in addition to serving as Pastor of St. Andrew Parish, I also serve as Vicar General for the Diocese of Columbus, Victim's Assistance Coordinator and Promoter of Justice. I have served under three Bishops over the course of 31 years. Since I became pastor of St. Andrew, I have typically given 2 days per week to these diocesan jobs, spending about 10-12 hours total at the Chancery on Tuesdays and Wednesdays, working in collaboration with Fr. Michael Lumpe, Vicar of Priests, and Deacon Tom Berg, Jr., Chancellor, to assist the Bishop in the governance and administration of the Diocese. Almost all priests have more than one job these days, so my situation was not unusual, although I had to miss certain events whether at the parish or at the diocese when conflicts occurred. Overall, it was usually no problem to get everything done on both fronts.

Recently, Bishop Brennan released Fr. Lumpe to serve as Vice Rector of the Pontifical College Josephinum. At the same time, he asked me to take on more responsibility for the day to day administration of the Diocese of Columbus. To accomplish this, I will need to spend four days per week at the Chancery, from 9:00 a.m.-4:00 p.m., Monday through Thursday, in order to be available to assist Bishop Brennan and complete my increased volume of work. I am pleased that Bishop Brennan has not asked me to give up the pastorate of St. Andrew to do this, but it does amount to having two full-time jobs. I have not been relieved of any parish duties, so I must find ways to get everything done.

In order to accomplish this, I must make some adjustments. I do not expect my presence and activity on the weekend to be affected. You will still see me at Saturday and Sunday Masses. On weekdays, I will be celebrating the 6:30 a.m. Mass most days, so I am able to be at the Chancery by 9:00 a.m. I will make sure that I celebrate the 8:30 a.m. Wednesday, all-school Masses frequently so I do not lose the opportunity to be with the school community. I hope to still be able to take Friday as my day off and get away to my home in Ada. I will need this break more than ever! I am really depending on Fr. Lehigh and the excellent, hard-working staff of St. Andrew Parish to keep things running smoothly. My appointments and meetings with parishioners will mostly be in the evening and weekends. I will still be available to all, though we may have to adjust the time and place of our meeting. I will probably be doing more communication by email and texting. I am sure I will be working late in the evening on Mass and homily preparations. I plan to continue to be present for meetings of the Parish and Finance Councils, though I may drift off during the meeting!

I share this with you now in the hopes that you will understand my absence from St. Andrew during the day. I will do my best to get everything done and serve both Bishop Brennan and the parishioners of St. Andrew to the best of my ability. I hope that I can count on your support and prayers! May God bless you all!


