Dear Parishioners:

Last Sunday, our peace and security were once again shattered by the reports of senseless violence and murder in El Paso, Texas and Dayton, Ohio. I no longer know what to say in response to these terrifying events. Because we ourselves, like the victims of these brutal attacks, frequent stores and restaurants in neighborhoods similar to those places of death. We feel not only shock and sadness, but also great vulnerability as we wonder when such violence will visit us in our neighborhood. We feel helpless in the face of this threat. As those who have been in helpless situations have always done, we turn to God our help in prayer. Let us pray for the victims and families of those killed and wounded by all violent attacks; let us plead with God to bring an end to all such murderous attacks. We who are helpless turn to God for help. And there is one more thing we can do. We must love one another with great intentionality. Life is fragile and fleeting, so we must never pass up or postpone an opportunity to show our love for others. Perhaps if we all showed more love for others, there would be less hate and violence. That is what I pray for!

On to other matters: This is Festival Week, and we are all looking forward to the good times and fun of this annual event on Friday and Saturday. I am especially looking forward to meeting and greeting all of you there! But I don't want you to forget another important event this week: Thursday, August 15 is the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, a Holy Day of Obligation. Masses are Wednesday, August 14 at 7:00 p.m. and Thursday at 6:30 and 8:30 a.m. and 12:15 p.m. Please be sure to park in the Reed Road parking lot. I also want to congratulate and thank all those who have pledged or contributed to the 2019 Bishop's Annual Appeal. According to our calculations, we have met our goal in pledges! As you know, our goal increased significantly over 2018, and last year we just missed making our goal. So thanks to all who contributed – you exceeded my expectations.




