PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Parishioners:

The season of Autumn is here which is always my favorite time of year. I look forward to the cooler weather, the blue skies and the falling leaves. As the days get shorter and the flowers fade, I treasure the golden sunlight all the more because the gray gloomy days of winter will not be far behind. When I savor the autumn sun and blue skies, I am moved to exclaim in the words of the psalm "The heavens proclaim the Glory of God!" Pumpkins have become a symbol of Autumn. People decorate their porches with pumpkins at this time of year. We even decorate the church with them. I observed the bulletin board outside the Religious Education office which was covered with orange paper cut-out pumpkins which the children had written their names on. They formed a sort of "pumpkin patch" and above it were the words "Handpicked by God." I thought to myself that all of us need to remember that our God has chosen each and every one of us and "picked" us to be His own!

This week, the Priests' Convocation takes place. I have mentioned this several times already as I do not want anyone to be surprised that the priests are away for several days. 
