PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Parishioners:

I want to give all of you some information from the Diocese of Columbus Priests' Convocation which I participated in last week. Most of the priests of the Diocese were gathered at Maumee Bay State Park from September 30 through October 3. The purpose of the convocation was to familiarize the priests with the current state of the Diocese in order to prepare us to undertake a process of strategic planning for the future.

We examined the current realities based on numbers in four crucial areas: priests, parishes, schools and finances. We also looked at trends and future projections in these four areas as well. The number of priests continues to decline and is already below the number needed to effectively minister to the needs of the people and parishes of the Diocese. Many priests are doing more than one job in order to meet the needs (how well I know!). Careful planning will be needed in order to make the most effective, efficient and realistic use of our resources in the future. The planning process is just beginning, but the priests have been given the understanding they will need to intelligently participate in the planning process. We are fortunate at St. Andrew Parish because we have three priests ministering to parishioners, Fr. Lehigh, Fr. DeVille and myself. I do not know how long this will continue, but we need to be thankful.

I hope you are enjoying the beauty of Autumn and give thanks to God continuously for all His wonderful gifts!

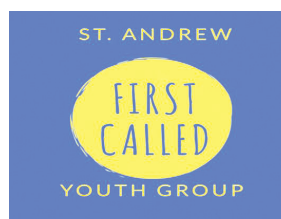
