PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Parishioners:

October is observed as "Respect Life Month" in the Church throughout the United States. The Church asks us to reflect more deeply on the dignity of each and every human life, and calls us to defend and protect every human life from its very beginning to its very end. That phrase we use so often when we speak or pray about protecting and defending human life "from conception to natural death," is not a cliché but a very accurate way of stating that the dignity of every human person must be respected and defended at every stage of life.

In the times in which we live, we are repeatedly shocked by the callous disregard for human life whenever there is an active shooter situation. We wonder how someone could mercilessly and senselessly kill other human beings. But our American society in general is no longer shocked by the killing of unborn human beings by abortion. It is our duty as Catholics to insist that every human life be protected from conception to natural death.

Abortion is not the only threat to the dignity of the human person, but it is certainly a major one. I want to thank the Knights of Columbus St. Andrew Council for organizing our parish's participation in the "40 Days for Life" prayer vigil, as well as all of those who participated in this peaceful and prayerful witness to the dignity of human life.

"Respect Life" is not just a slogan or a theme. It is a fundamental moral principle of the Catholic faith and an essential part of the gospel message, of the "good news" of salvation. This is because "respect the dignity of every human person" has the same meaning and imposes the same moral obligation as "you should love your neighbor as yourself." Let us protect and defend human life in all of its stages. Let us raise awareness and advocate for the vulnerable and defenseless, the marginalized and expendable, the unwanted and unloved, not only during October but always!

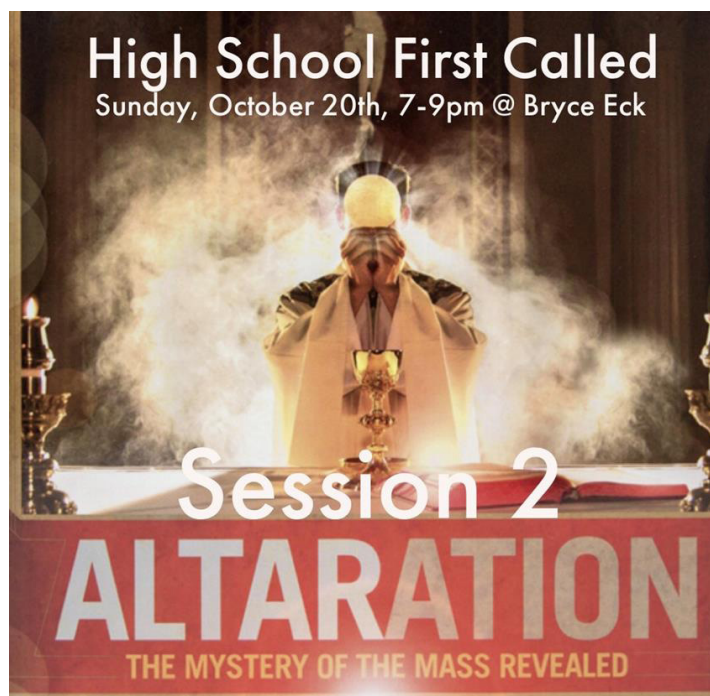
