**PASTOR'S CORNER**

Dear Parishioners:

Since I was away for much of this past week at the priest convocation, I am sharing with you a homily of mine from a few weeks ago.

In the first reading that day, St. Paul tells us that the Church is the “*pillar and foundation of the truth*.” If you take a look at our church of Saint Andrew, you can see that it has pillars. Pillars are strong columns that support the structure of the church building. The pillars hold up the roof of the church and keep it from caving in and falling down on us. The foundation of the church is not so visible to us from inside the church, because the foundation is below us. This whole church building is built on a heavy concrete foundation that goes deep into the ground. It rests on the bedrock below the ground. The foundation supports the whole church building and makes it strong and unshakable.

The Church, which is the “*household of God*” and the “*Church of the living God*” is not just the church building, made up of windows and walls and floor, roof and foundation and pillars. It is the Body of Christ, made up of living stones, with Jesus himself as the key stone. And the Church is the pillar and foundation of truth. That means the Church is built on the solid foundation of Jesus Christ, who is the truth. Jesus once said the reason He was born was to witness to the truth. The Church is the pillar of truth because the Church, like Jesus Himself, witnesses to the truth, the Church upholds the truth.

All of us seek the truth. We want to know the truth. Jesus told us, “*You shall know the truth, and the truth will set you free.*” Dear friends, the Church is the pillar and foundation of the truth. If you seek the truth, you will find it in the Church.




