PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Parishioners,

In this month of November, the church honors and remembers "those who have gone before us, marked with the sign of faith." We pray for our deceased loved ones and all of the "faithful departed." I thought perhaps that this month would be a good time to say a few words about the Catholic Funeral Rites.

A funeral is not an everyday event for most people. But sooner or later a death occurs in our family or to someone close to us. We may have the solemn responsibility of making funeral arrangements and planning a funeral liturgy. A Catholic funeral expresses the faith of the Church in the victory of Jesus over sin and death. In every Mass, we proclaim the "mystery of faith"; "We proclaim your death O Lord, and profess your Resurrection, until you come again." "In the face of death, the Church confidently proclaims that God has created each person for eternal life and that Jesus, the Son of God, by His death and resurrection, has broken the chains of sin and death." (Order of Funerals, #1).

A Catholic funeral focuses on the death and Resurrection of Christ, and not just a "celebration of life" of the deceased one. This is why the Church generally discourages eulogizing the deceased. The funeral should express our hope and our trust in God who is merciful, asking God to forgive the sins of the deceased and receive him/her into the heavenly Kingdom. The funeral is usually celebrated with a Mass, because the Mass celebrates the paschal mystery of Christ's death and Resurrection. The mourners are consoled and comforted by receiving the Lord in Holy Communion. At the funeral Mass, the body of the deceased is honored: it is sprinkled with holy water and covered with the white pall to recall the Sacrament of Baptism. The body is incensed at the final commendation, and then taken to its place of rest, preferably in a dedicated Catholic cemetery. While cremation is permitted by the Church, burial of the body is still preferred, as the Lord Jesus' body was laid in the tomb from which He was raised up on the third day.

I hope these few brief reflections on the Catholic funeral may help you to appreciate its meaning the next time you participate in one.

May all of the faithful departed rest in peace.


