Dear Parishioners,

This week we celebrate Catholic Schools Week. The Catholic Schools are a most important asset of our parish and community because it is through the Catholic School that our children grow in "wisdom, age, and grace." We are proud of our students and teachers of St. Andrew School & Preschool, as well as Bishop Watterson High School & St. Charles Preparatory School. St. Andrew School provides an excellent education and promotes the highest academic achievement. But what makes St. Andrew School and all Catholic schools different is that the Catholic School not only educates its students, it also, and more importantly, forms them in the faith, conforms them more and more to Christ and builds them up in the values of the gospel. That's what Catholic Schools are all about, and that's what we celebrate during Catholic Schools Week!

Next Sunday, February 2nd is the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord. Since this feast falls on a Sunday this year, we celebrate it at the weekend Masses. This feast also is known as Candlemas Day. It commemorates the occasion when the child Jesus was presented in the Temple and Simeon proclaimed that Jesus was "a light for revelation to the Gentiles." It is tradition to bless candles on this day and for a procession to take place at the beginning of Mass. The carrying of lighted candles into the church recalls Jesus, the "light of the world" entering the Temple. 

New Adult Faith Formation Offering

Christians today have lots of different opinions about what "worship" should look like. Some think it should be all preaching, others think it should be "entertaining," still others think it's all about the music. But what does *the Bible* say about worship? And why do Catholics do what they do at Mass? Why all the standing, sitting, kneeling, and repetition? Where does it all come from? - * **The Biblical Roots of the Mass:** How does the Bible unlock the mysteries behind the words and actions in the Mass?

Many Catholics know what to do at Mass, but not *why* we do it. And many non-Catholics are confused by the rituals and words of the Mass. Some even think that most of the Mass is just "made up" – a tradition of men. If you've ever wondered about whether or not the Mass is biblical, then look no further: *Why We Worship* is the perfect resource for parishes, RCIA programs, Bible Studies--for anyone who wants to understand what the Bible really says about the mystery and meaning of worship. **Why We Worship** By Dr. Brant Pitre...noted theologian and author. 
