PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Parishioners,

This week we begin the solemn and holy season of Lent. We begin the Lenten observance with Ash Wednesday, which is a day of fast and abstinence. At Mass on Ash Wednesday, we are signed with ashes, a sign of repentance and sorry for sin, but also a reminder of our mortality, as we are admonished to "remember you are dust and unto dust, you shall return." Lent is a solemn season and we must take it seriously.

Jesus began His ministry by preaching "Repent for the Kingdom of God is at hand." Truthfully, that call to repentance continues to the present day. Christ continually calls us to conversion, a process that is never complete in this life. Each Lent, the Church intensifies that urgent call to conversion and repentance and urges us to forsake sin and believe in the Gospel. We are urged to fast, pray, and intentionally give alms during this season. We are enjoined to refrain from eating meat on the Fridays of Lent or Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. But this should be the minimum. We should voluntarily fast from what we do not really need, we should refrain from all overindulgence in food and drink. We should also refrain from frivolity and worldly luxuries, sensual delights, and profane entertainment, and opt for self-denial, sober meditations, tears and sorrow for our sins, and generosity to the needy and destitute. St. Andrew Parish provides many opportunities to support your observance of Lent: daily Mass, many opportunities for Confession and Reconciliation, Friday Stations of the Cross, Exposition, and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament with Compline and Benediction on Tuesday evenings – just to name a few.

I want to urge each and every one of you to be serious about your observance of Lent and heed to the Lord's call to repent and believe the Good News!

ASH WEDNESDAY

— THE BEGINNING OF LENT —



WHAT IS ASH WEDNESDAY

Ash Wednesday is the first day of Lent. Palm branches blessed on Palm Sunday of the previous year are burned to create ashes which will be imposed on the faithful's foreheads.

WHY USE ASHES

Since the Old Testament, ashes have been a symbol of repentance. Imposing it upon the faithful's forehead is a reminder and an invitation to repent, and follow God.

WHAT IS LENT

The 40-day period from Ash Wednesday and before Easter Sunday. It is marked by praying, fasting, abstinence, and other acts of penance.



WHAT IS FASTING



One meal a day, and two smaller meals which if added together would not exceed one full meal

WHAT IS ABSTINENCE



Abstinence is refraining from eating meat. Meat is considered to be the flesh and organs of mammals and fowl.


