FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners:

This weekend we observe the Third Sunday of Easter-- and the Sixth Sunday of Pandemic Exile! There are still no public Masses and no Holy Communion for the Faithful. We have recently learned that school is closed for the remainder of the school year. Our students will not be returning to the classroom any more this academic year. That means our graduates will not be able to observe the usual traditions as they complete their schooling, which is sad. I am very impressed, however, with how well our St. Andrew School students and faculty have continued the learning process remotely, and have not let the difficult circumstances interrupt their education! We do not know what conditions may prevail in the Fall when the next school year begins--but we do know there will not be an increase in tuition! With all of the economic hardship resulting from the pandemic, I did not want to increase the burden on our school families by raising tuition.

As we wait for an official beginning of the "re-opening" of the State of Ohio, we are given some hope that our churches may soon be opening up again also. At this time, we do not know when this will happen or exactly how it will happen. We can only speculate. But one thing is certain--it will take place gradually, slowly, and not all at once. We will not return to "normal" right away. There will still be strict "social distancing" requirements. It will still be necessary to avoid close contact, to use face masks, to use sanitizer and disinfectant. Those in higher-risk categories will still be urged to stay at home. I suspect that the number of people permitted to be in church at any given time will be limited in some way. The sign of peace and communion from the cup will remain suspended. Again, I do not know when we may be permitted to open up again (though I hope it will be soon) but I want you to be aware that when it happens, things will not be "the way they used to be" for quite some time.

I do want to remind you that, even though Mass and other sacraments are not currently being celebrated publicly, it is still possible, if necessary, to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation by appointment. Those who have need of this sacrament and are not currently ill may call the priests here at St. Andrew's and arrange a private appointment for confession. Of course, all precautions must be observed.

May all of you be strengthened in faith, hope, and love as we continue to make our way together through this unusual and uncertain time!

During this time, two ways to live out faithful citizenship are offered: voting in the Ohio primary election and taking part in the U.S. Census.

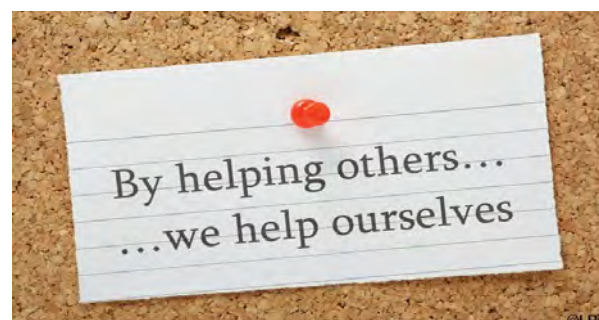
The pandemic forced cancellation of in-person voting on March 17, the scheduled day of the primary. Eligible Ohioans are offered the chance to vote by mail. In-person voting will be limited to people with disabilities or who lack a home address by Tuesday, April 28.

Step 1: Voters who did not already cast a vote in the 2020 primary election should visit the website www.voteohio.gov (or your county board of elections) to request a mail-in ballot.

Step 2: Once you have completed your application, mail it to your county board of elections (the address may be found at www.voteohio.gov). **Applications for ballots must be received by Saturday, April 25.** The county board of elections will then send you an absentee ballot in the mail.

Step 3: Pray, Reflect, Vote.

Step 4: After completing your ballot, mail it to your county board of elections. Ballots must be postmarked by **Monday, April 27** to be counted.

Recognize God In Your Ordinary Moments

Mean What You Say

Missouri is known as the "Show Me" state. There seem to be differing points of view as to how this motto came into existence, but today it is said to speak of a people who operate with common sense and are not easily fooled by slick-talking or show. We would be prudent to adopt such a disposition ourselves. To be this way is not really like St. Thomas in the Gospel when he doubts what he clearly sees right in front of him. It is more about holding ourselves to a standard explained in another motto: "Say what you mean and mean what you say."

If we claim to be Christians, disciples of the risen Jesus, then those around us should be able to tell by our actions. Can someone truly be a disciple of Jesus and not be a good steward of all he has given? Jesus makes himself known to us continually in the Holy Eucharist. When we come together to break bread at Mass, Jesus shows us his love by becoming truly present to us. He is willing to show us. What are we in turn willing to show him?

Every day, Jesus calls us to respond in some way. Our response shows whether we are who we claim: his disciples. I am pretty sure Jesus is not from Missouri, but I know he is not fooled by our half-truths and misguided intentions. He also means what he says and says what he means. Shouldn't his disciples do the same?



St Catherine became a nun at age 15. At the age of 6, she received visions of Jesus. She served the poor and worked to convert sinners. She received great wisdom and insight and even counseled the Pope.

As a child, St. Catherine of Siena had mystical experiences, seeing guardian angels of others. She was a Dominican and one of the most brilliant theological minds of her day. She continued to have visions of Christ, Mary and the Saints. She was give the Stigmata which became visible after her death. St. Catherine's letters are considered the most brilliant writings in the history of the Catholic Church

GOSPEL MEDITATION

Encourage Deeper
Understanding of Scripture

What does it take for our eyes to be opened? Every day, a man laboriously walks down Main Street of town. With great difficulty but graceful determination, he places one foot in front of the other, uses a crudely made staff for support, and walks. His pace is slow, but he walks. What does he hope to see? Where does he hope to go? What does he find? We all walk through life. The type of "walking" life requires is not always physical but is most assuredly emotional and spiritual. We walk, we look, we encounter, and we seek. How we do these things and what we actually find is determined by what we carry and what we allow ourselves to discover along the way

If walking is too challenging for us, we may choose to isolate and stay alone. If we are afraid to walk, we may become overly dependent on others providing for us and abandon the journey. We can walk and pay attention only to what is in front of our feet and never notice the immensity of what is happening around us. The road is never the same twice. The journey is



always different. What kinds of things do you notice as you walk through life? It seems that the disciples of the Road to Emmaus missed a lot at first. We do as well.

We are called to walk with purpose, to listen, and to notice things that may not at first be apparent. We have to allow the One who has a special claim on our soul to enlighten, instruct, and inspire us. The incarnate mystery of God is pulsating in and through all of creation, where the presence of the Word who became flesh can be discovered. He has been with us

all along. How could we have missed Him? Our journey brings us back to the breaking of the bread, and something begins to stir within us. We begin to understand, and things look differently. Bread, body, wine, and blood bring us to see that everyone and everything is a "Eucharistic" encounter. We become what we eat and we see what we eat. We continue to walk. Our eyes are now opened, and we recognize Him. Our hearts burn. Stay with us.

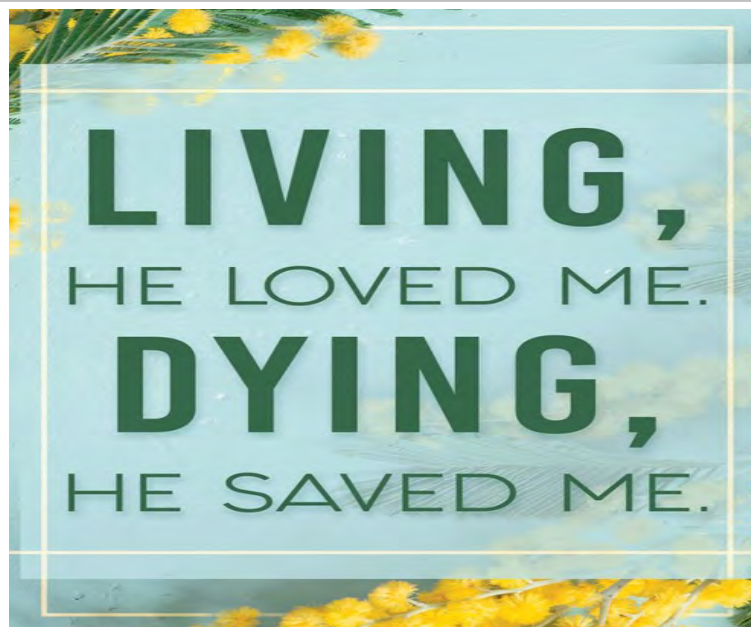

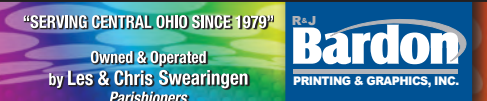
