FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend three new priests are being ordained for the Diocese of Columbus. We congratulate Fr. Frank Brown, Fr. Michael Fulton, and Fr. Seth Keller on this happy occasion! Fr. Brown is known to us as he served as a deacon here at St. Andrew Parish during the last year--until the pandemic halted everything. The ordination of priests is always a joyous event for the church community, especially because we need priests and rely on the ministry of priests. The priest manifests the presence of Christ in the community of the church.

Unfortunately, the shortage of priests continues and the distribution of priests to care for all of the people of the

Diocese is still a great challenge for the Diocese of Columbus.

By now you may have heard that Fr. T.J. Lehigh, our associate pastor, is being re-assigned. He has been appointed by Bishop Brennan as the next pastor of the Perry County Consortium of Parishes, which consists of four parishes! Fr. Lehigh has been a great help these past two years and has been a hard-working and effective minister. He is loved and appreciated by all of us. I will very much miss him, but I know that he is ready and capable to take on this new and challenging assignment, and he will be a great blessing to his new parish family.

I am also pleased to inform you that Fr. William Ferguson has been named as Parochial Vicar for St. Andrew Parish. Fr. Ferguson is an experienced priest, who comes to us from

Our Lady of Lourdes Parish (Ada) and Immaculate Conception Parish (Kenton) where he serves as pastor. I am very happy that I will have the help of Fr. Ferguson along with the continuing help of Fr. DeVille. With my continuing and increasing obligations to serve Bishop Brennan and the Diocese of Columbus, I could not fulfill all of my duties to St. Andrew Parish without the help of these generous priests. The new assignments are effective July 14. Because of COVID19 restrictions, we won't be able to have the typical farewell reception for Fr. Lehigh, nor welcome reception for Fr. Ferguson, so I urge you to reach out to them and express your sentiments at the appropriate time.

SCHEDULING MASS INTENTIONS

The practice of requesting a Mass to be offered for a loved one – living or deceased – is a beautiful and wonderful part of our Catholic tradition and to ensure all who wish to schedule a Mass for loved ones may do so, **a new Mass Intention procedure has been put into effect immediately.**

- † All Mass Intention requests should be made in writing or in person (at the present time due to limited office staffing, we are not currently taking in person requests) & must be accompanied by payment. **While you may call or email to check the availability of certain dates or times, requests will not be finalized over the phone and will not be reserved until payment is received.**
- † Request forms are available in the pamphlet racks in the parlor and NW entrance or you may send an email or note (accompanied with payment) with the name(s) of the deceased, dates & times requested and your contact information. Only one intention (person) per Mass is allowed, however for pastoral concerns to better accommodate the needs of parishioners, two first names (David & Catherine Smith) or two last names (Scott & Smith Families) are acceptable.
- † We will do our best to honor the date(s) & times requested, but unfortunately, no date or time can be guaranteed. Once scheduled, we will send a list of the Masses scheduled for your records.
- † Families may schedule up to twelve (12) Masses per year with four (4) of those on weekends. Additional Masses will be accepted, but these will be scheduled when dates are available throughout the year on a rotating basis.
- † A \$10 stipend, as determined by Diocesan policy, is to accompany each Mass request. **Please make check payable to St. Andrew Parish** with Mass Stipend in memo section of check. Payment, along with request form or note with Mass dates/times requested may be placed in an envelope marked "Mass Intentions" & placed in the weekend collection basket or mailed to the parish office at St. Andrew Parish, Attn: Mass Intentions, 1899 McCoy Rd., Columbus, OH 43220.

We Are Never Alone

What else is there to give when one has already given away one's body and one's life? What more can one say or do to demonstrate love for another when all one had has been given to another? This total giving of self to loved ones cannot be trumped by flowery words or material gifts that are fleeting. This is the ultimate in love. This is the love Jesus had for us on the way to His Passion, at the institution of the Holy Eucharist. This is the love He has for us daily in the celebration of the Mass on altars in every church, in every city, in every nation on earth. No one can give more. No one can ask for more. This is the true heart of Christian stewardship.

If you take the time to gaze upon your God in the simplest of forms and begin to reflect on what has actually taken place with bread and wine becoming the presence of the Divine, then you can begin to understand true humility, sacrifice, and love. And when you have the privilege to take that Real Presence into your body at the meal where you are an honored guest, you become one with the One who is the embodiment of stewardship.

Then, you must ask yourself, "How can I even begin to reflect the love that I have encountered at this feast?" The answer is you can begin with the simple actions of the day: where will you go, whom will you meet, and in what work will you partake? Jesus Christ has shown that the greatest gift ever given can be disguised in this world in a piece of bread. By joining your body to His, He can now transform human hearts, not by grand acts, but by everyday acts, by everyday people, practicing Everyday Stewardship.

WHY DO WE DO THAT?

Catholic Life Explained:

Question:

WHY DO CATHOLICS PRAY TO MARY AND THE SAINTS?

One of the statements of faith we make when we pray the Nicene Creed and the Apostles Creed is that we believe in "the communion of saints." The Catechism of the Catholic Church reminds us that this communion (another word for community) includes all the faithful on earth, the souls in Purgatory, and the blessed women, men, and children who are in heaven. This teaching is grounded in our belief that, through Baptism, we are united with Christ and to one another with bonds that are stronger even than death.

And so from the time of the early Church, Christians have turned to other believers for prayers and assistance, including those who have gone before us, confident that God hears the prayers of all of His children. While we ask the saints (and one another) for prayers and support, we remember that the saints join us in prayer. But it is God who blesses and sanctifies us.

When we think of Mary and the saints in heaven, we have to remember that we can turn to them for intercession and assistance because they were faulted, limited human beings, just like us. This means that they are able to understand our struggles, doubts, fears, joys, and hopes. But as we learn their stories, we can also begin to recognize that they stand out in the history of the Church because they persevered in their commitment to follow Christ. Whether they were ordained, vowed religious, martyrs, husbands, wives, or even children, they show us that holiness is possible. We can not only follow their example but also benefit from their prayerful support.

Our devotion to the saints and gratitude for their witness, prayers, and protection should also be an inspiration for us, especially when we become aware of the needs of others or when others ask us to pray for them. We are called to share the blessings we receive. This is also part of our own journey of growing in holiness.

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

It is no wonder that followers of Christ are called the Body of Christ. After all, sharing in the same spiritual food and sacred meal, they become what they eat and reveal the Divine Image. There is so much power for healing in the community of believers. Through the Eucharist, Christ becomes as present in those who have partaken of his Body and Blood as he has the elements themselves. The very presence of God touches the depths of the human soul and visits a part of us that no human being can ever hope to explore. We are God's. The sacred Eucharistic meal is a celebration of intimacy, the reunion of two loves in constant search of and longing for the other.

The community of believers receives the power and the presence to touch and heal in the name of the One they have welcomed within. It is now within their grasp to change the way life is lived and to more intentionally put into practice the Beatitudes that the Divine Guest has revealed. We are asked to be like Christ and work to create a world of sufficiency, where the greed of some no longer creates the want of



others but where all of God's children can find a home and a place at the table of life. The One who makes a home within calls us to live a life that transforms. We are changed ourselves and now become agents of change for others. We are the Body of Christ. God is with us. We have been nourished.

Sadly, many are afraid to try. We know what we are called to do, but we struggle with feelings of doubt as to whether God really is the Way, the Truth, and the Life. Do our systems have to change? Is it

possible that we somehow missed the mark when we put all of our social networks in place and established the business of our lives? Perhaps we have to radically rethink our approach and that can scare us. We might have to give something up or change, and we don't want to. As long as want, injustice, division, prejudice, and scarcity still exist, there is tremendous work for the Body of Christ.

“Just as the living Father sent me and I have life because of the Father, so also the one who feeds on me will have life because of me. This is the bread that came down from heaven. Unlike your ancestors who ate and still died, whoever eats this bread will live forever.” - Jn 6:57-58

Dear Parishioners of St. Andrew,

I wanted to let you know that I was recently asked by Bishop Brennan to become pastor of the Perry County Consortium of Catholic Churches. I have accepted this assignment, and my last day at St. Andrew will be Sunday, July 12, 2020.

I am grateful to have gotten to know many of you, learn from you, and help to contribute to the St. Andrew Parish community. Even amidst a pandemic, I believe good things are happening here and the light of Christ is still shining. I ask for your prayers as I enter my new assignment in July.

I leave you with this short story: Back in March, I was scheduled to lead Stations of the Cross with St. Andrew school. However, when I walked over for the service in the afternoon, I was a bit disappointed to find out that stations had been canceled since the teachers needed more time to prepare work for students to take home during their three-week coronavirus 'break.' Though I was just going to head back over to the office, I had a moment of intuition, as if someone said to me "you may not see all these students again together as a school; why don't you visit their classrooms and leave them with a blessing?"

Here's the prayer I left with them, and I offer it for all of you:

*Grant, Lord God, that we, Your servants,
may rejoice in unfailing health of mind and body,
and, through the glorious intercession of
Blessed Mary ever-Virgin,
may we be set free from present sorrow
and come to enjoy eternal happiness.
Through our Lord, Jesus Christ, Your Son,

one God for ever and ever. Amen.*
