FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend, we celebrate Father's Day, and I want to wish all fathers, grandfathers, step-fathers, foster fathers, fathers-in-law, and father figures a Happy Father's Day! Jesus taught us to call God "Our Father," and thus revealed the great importance of the relationship of fatherhood. Jesus taught that, just as fathers know how to give good things to their children, so also our heavenly Father will always bestow His good gifts upon those who pray to Him. God the Father is the source of all fatherhood. All those who are called fathers derive their role and their title from God. more people venture out, it is all the more important to observe these precautions faithfully. It is how we care for ourselves and one another in the present circumstances.

These next two weeks were supposed to be my annual vacation. Due to important obligations that have encroached upon this coming week, I will probably only be away starting Friday, June 26 through Saturday, July 4. For the most part, I will be spending that time at my home in my hometown of Ada. I hope the weather is not too warm, as I don't have air-conditioning there! I hope to return refreshed and renewed. In the meantime, I wish all of you happy and pleasant Summer days!



SCHEDULING MASS INTENTIONS

The practice of requesting a Mass to be offered for a loved one – living or deceased – is a beautiful and wonderful part of our Catholic tradition and to ensure all who wish to schedule a Mass for loved ones may do so, a new Mass Intention procedure has been put into effect immediately.

- † All Mass Intention requests should be made in writing or in person (at the present time due to limited office staffing, we are not currently taking in person requests) & must be accompanied by payment. **While you may call or email to check the availability of certain dates or times, requests will not be finalized over the phone and will not be reserved until payment is received.**
- † Request forms are available in the pamphlet racks in the parlor and NW entrance or you may send an email or note (accompanied with payment) with the name(s) of the deceased, dates & times requested and your contact information. Only one intention (person) per Mass is allowed, however, for pastoral concerns to better accommodate the needs of parishioners, two first names (David & Catherine Smith) or two last names (Scott & Smith Families) are acceptable.
- † We will do our best to honor the date(s) & times requested, but unfortunately, no date or time can be guaranteed. Once scheduled, we will send a list of the Masses scheduled for your records.
- † Families may schedule up to twelve (12) Masses per year with four (4) of those on weekends. Additional Masses will be accepted, but these will be scheduled when dates are available throughout the year on a rotating basis.
- † A \$10 stipend, as determined by Diocesan policy, is to accompany each Mass request. **Please make check payable to St. Andrew Parish** with Mass Stipend in memo section of check. Payment, along with request form or note with Mass dates/times requested may be placed in an envelope marked "Mass Intentions" & placed in the weekend collection basket or mailed to the parish office at St. Andrew Parish Attn: Mass Intentions 1899 McCoy Rd., Columbus, OH 43220.

Recognize God in Your Ordinary Moments

We Are Never Alone

You find yourself in the difficult situation of being accused of blasphemy and confronting possible execution. Your crime is believing in Jesus Christ. The question is then asked of you, "Are you a Christian, a follower of the one named Jesus Christ?" Your answer may very well dictate what happens to you next. What is your answer?

It is probably easier to answer this question when the scenario is make-believe. All of us want to believe that we would say yes to the question of belief in Jesus, but strange things happen when humans panic in the face of extreme stress. As we reflect on what we would say, there are those all over the world who are being asked that very same question. It is a question that was asked of many in the first centuries of the Church. Those who respond "yes" are considered martyrs and saints.

We might not usually think of all this in terms of good stewardship living. However, our faith is also a gift we have received from God to cultivate, grow, and share with others. The more interesting question than the one posed above is, "Would an accuser even think of asking you such a question?" Would you have cultivated, grown, and shared your faith enough that anyone would even consider you worthy of asking the question? They might assume you don't know Jesus Christ at all. I don't like conflict and do not seek out conflict, but I would rather someone ask the first question posed than assume there is no reason to confront me in the first place.

WHY DO WE DO THAT?

Catholic Life Explained:

WHY DO CATHOLICS MAKE A CROSS ON THEIR FOREHEAD, LIPS & HEART BEFORE HEARING THE GOSPEL?

During Mass, we make a little cross on our head, lips, and heart, because these outward gestures made with our bodies are pointing to an inward prayer that is happening in our hearts.

When the Gospel is about to be read, the priest says: 'A Reading from the Gospel according to St ____.' The congregation then responds, 'Glory to You Oh Lord,' making a small cross with their thumb over their forehead, lips, and chest.

Remember, the cross itself is a sign of redemption in and through Jesus Christ. When we make this sign of the cross, in any form, it's an outward act to profess our inward faith in the Trinity. This sign declares that, through our Baptism, we belong to God.

The reason for making a cross during this period of the Mass is to highlight the importance of the Word of God we are about to hear. St. Paul taught us, 'For the Word of God is living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing to the division of soul and spirit, of joints and marrow, and discerning the thoughts and intentions of the heart' (Hebrews 4:12).

In the outward sign of crossing our forehead, lips, and heart, we are asking that the Word of God pierce our mind, lips, and hearts.

We cross our forehead so that the Word of God may be in our thoughts and purify our minds. We cross our lips so that our speech may be holy and incline us to share the Gospel with others. And we cross our hearts to invite God to strengthen our love for Him and others. All of this is so that we might know, proclaim, and love Jesus Christ all the more.

So next time you're at Mass and the Gospel is about to be proclaimed pray that 'The word of God be ever in my mind, proclaimed by my lips, and pierce my heart leading me to deeper communion with you, Jesus.'

GOSPEL MEDITATION

Encourage Deeper
Understanding of Scripture

There are many things of which we can be afraid: being rebuked, rejection, anger, being challenged, having to defend ourselves, standing alone, insecurity, failure, and even death. For some, identifying and overcoming their fears is a daunting task. Regardless of how much they may want to break the cycle of fear, they find that they remain close friends with old and dysfunctional behavioral habits and norms. Maybe what they really fear is change. There are many who gravitate to the familiar and comfortable, and find safety and security in doing so, even if they remain mired in mediocrity. Human beings have to learn that there is life beyond the "what has always been" and that happiness and depth are possible when old structures, systems & processes have to be left behind.

Can you leave the near and dear, the comfortable and familiar, the safe and secure, and discover new opportunities? The sheer thought of doing so can bring on feelings of apprehension, intense anger, resentment, defensiveness, reluctance,




resistance, and even apathy. If we have to be responsible for making the change, cowardice can creep in. If someone else is to blame for making the change, any number of possible negative reactions are possible. In the end, only one thing is required and that is God. If I can rely on and deepen my relationship with God, especially in the Eucharist along with a community of believers, then little else is of great concern. We have to figure out what is really important. It is not always what we think.

The Gospel calls us to stretch ourselves and try new things, not to remain stuck and stagnant in familiar ways. We are

asked to live life more deliberately, radically, and intentionally. We are asked to leave the familiar behind and learn to live with changing, and often limiting, human structures.

We cannot get too caught up in the physical, ideological, or structural systems we are used to. The Holy Spirit always leads and guides us. If we trust this, we will find ourselves doing things we never thought we could do. Always seek the path to joy and love. They keep us from falling victim to our fears and from seeking the nostalgic crutches we think we need to achieve a sense of well-being and happiness.
