FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

As you read this message, I am away on my shortened annual vacation, in far-away, enchanting Ada, Ohio! I will be relaxing there through the Fourth of July Holiday. As we approach the holiday weekend, when we celebrate our freedom and independence as a nation, I am sure that all of us wish we were free of the threat of the coronavirus. Three months ago, when the pandemic first reached Ohio and we began "social distancing," and working from home, I thought to myself at that time that everything would be back to normal by Summer. Maybe you thought that, too! However, the pandemic is still very much with us, and we must still be very careful.

Our attendance at Sunday Masses increased by about 75 last weekend--and in fact, at the 11:00 Mass, all the available pews were occupied. This weekend you will notice a change, as now we are permitting seating in every other pew, rather than every third pew. This will allow for more seating while still preserving social distancing, and keeping the total number of occupants under the recommended 30% of the maximum occupancy. It remains very important that everyone who comes to church wears a

face mask while in church, for your own protection and that of others in attendance. The medical professionals who have been assisting the Diocese of Columbus with our safety procedures, tell us that the wearing of the mask does indeed protect both the wearer and others from the virus. If you should happen to come to church without your mask, we do have some available, and the ushers can provide one for you.

We are still observing precautions in other church activities also, and are adjusting the celebration of weddings and funerals to conform with our safety guidelines. St. Andrew School, like all schools, is preparing for the upcoming school year, while not knowing exactly what to expect. We are preparing to use the Parish Hall for classroom space because the students will need space to spread out for proper social distancing. This means that the Parish Hall will most likely be unavailable for other uses for some time.

I am pleased to tell you that St. Andrew has been awarded a \$5,000 grant from the Catholic Foundation to obtain a video camera system for live streaming our Sunday Masses. I got the idea for this last March as the Cathedral was installing a system to make the Holy Week services available. It seemed to me that if St. Andrew's had such a system, it would be a service to the homebound even after the pandemic is over. Fr.

Lehigh has been recording our Masses and making them available for a couple of months now--but with his forthcoming departure, he will not be able to continue this service. The new system will take some time to acquire and install. There may be an interruption in the availability of our Masses online. If anyone would like to help out with this, please let us know!

I am frequently asked by parishioners, "How is Mabel?" I haven't mentioned her for a while, and since I have been getting this question a lot, I thought I might give a little update. In case you don't know, Mabel is my dog. She is an 11-year-old miniature Dachshund. I am happy to say Mabel is well. She is definitely a "senior dog" and not quite as active, but she is happy and in good health. She has enjoyed having me around more the last few months while I was "working from home." Now that I am going back to my work at the Chancery Office more frequently, she is getting used to that routine, also. She is somewhat hard of hearing but has not had any serious medical issues for over a year. She is vacationing with me at my home in Ada, and she thanks you for asking about her!

I wish all of you a Happy Fourth of July holiday, and may God continue to bless our Nation and all of you!



SCHEDULING MASS INTENTIONS

The practice of requesting a Mass to be offered for a loved one – living or deceased – is a beautiful and wonderful part of our Catholic tradition and to ensure all who wish to schedule a Mass for loved ones may do so, a new Mass Intention procedure has been put into effect immediately.

- † All Mass Intention requests should be made in writing or in person (at the present time due to limited office staffing, we are not currently taking in-person requests) & must be accompanied by payment. **While you may call or email to check the availability of certain dates or times, requests will not be finalized over the phone and will not be reserved until payment is received.**
- † Request forms are available in the pamphlet racks in the parlor and NW entrance or you may send an email or note (accompanied with payment) with the name(s) of the deceased, dates & times requested and your contact information. Only one intention (person) per Mass is allowed, however, for pastoral concerns to better accommodate the needs of parishioners, two first names (David & Catherine Smith) or two last names (Scott & Smith Families) are acceptable.
- † We will do our best to honor the date(s) & times requested, but unfortunately, no date or time can be guaranteed. Once scheduled, we will send a list of the Masses scheduled for your records. You will be sent a confirmation of the date(s) and time(s) of the Mass(es) scheduled. Please allow 5-7 days for processing.
- † Families may schedule up to twelve (12) Masses per year with four (4) of those on weekends. Additional Masses will be accepted, but these will be scheduled when dates are available throughout the year on a rotating basis.
- † A \$10 stipend, as determined by Diocesan policy, is to accompany each Mass request. **Please make check payable to St. Andrew Parish** with Mass Stipend in memo section of check. Payment, along with request form or note with Mass dates/times requested may be placed in an envelope marked "Mass Intentions" & placed in the weekend collection basket or mailed to the parish office at St. Andrew Parish Attn: Mass Intentions 1899 McCoy Rd., Columbus, OH 43220.

ST. THOMAS THE APOSTLE

St. Thomas was one of the original Apostles. He was a dedicated follower of Christ. Thomas, unwilling to believe other Apostles had seen the risen Lord, earned the title "doubting Thomas." On Christ's second apparition, Thomas saw the wounds in our Lord's hands and side and proclaimed, "My Lord and My God."

As the Apostles dispersed, Thomas eventually reached India. St. Thomas is the patron saint of architects.



WHY DO WE DO THAT?

Catholic Life Explained:

WHY DO CATHOLICS CALL PRIESTS FATHER?

One of the common objections evangelical Christians have to Catholics is our practice of calling priests by the title Father. They will often cite a passage in Matthew's Gospel in which Jesus tells his followers: "Call no one on earth your father; you have but one Father in heaven" (23:19). It seems pretty straightforward, but when we put this verse in context, we see that Jesus is speaking out against religious leaders who had forgotten what their proper role was and who were bad examples through their own hypocrisy and elitist attitudes.

In other Gospels, we find Jesus himself using the title father for different characters, such as in the Parable of Lazarus and the Rich Man (Luke 16:19-31) and the Parable of the Prodigal Son (Luke 15:11-32). If we put the verse from Matthew into the full scope of Jesus' teachings, he isn't saying that we can't use words like "father," "rabbi," or "master." Rather, he is telling us that we should be mindful of the full meaning of those titles and not to misuse them.

To call a priest "Father" is more than a sign of respect for the office of the priesthood. It goes all the way back to the way St. Paul understood his own work as a missionary and evangelizer. Paul wrote, "I am writing you in this way not to shame you but to admonish you as my beloved children ... It was I who begot you in Christ Jesus through my preaching of the Gospel. I beg you, then, be imitators of me. This is why I have sent you Timothy, my beloved and faithful son in the Lord" (1 Corinthians 4:14-17).

Yes, we have God alone as our heavenly Father, but there are also those here with us who nurture and nourish our faith through their teaching and care. This is why the title of Father has been applied to the church's pastors in different ways since the earliest days of the Church, including monks and nuns using the title "abbot" and "abbess" (from abba) for their spiritual leaders and Christians around the world recognizing the "Holy Father" or "pope" (from papa) as the head of the family that is the Church. The title Father is a reminder that priests have a special responsibility to care for, protect, feed, listen to, and nourish those who have been entrusted to them, all after the example of our Father in heaven who never ceases to give us what we truly need.

GOSPEL MEDITATION

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

When we were baptized, we were baptized into Christ's death. Take a moment to ponder these profound words. We were baptized into death. In every sense of the word, we are asked to die. This is not just about our final death but about daily deaths due to inconvenience, discomfort, pain, loss, or others' needs. This is an incredible epiphany given the way we very often approach our lives. We do everything to avoid death, let alone encounter it! Many avoid pain, discomfort, inconvenience, uneasiness, change, interference, and suffering of any kind. We put a lot of energy into finding the easiest and least inconvenient way through many things. Even holding the door open for a stranger or saying hello to someone in the store can be major undertakings.


We are called to die. One of the biggest wake-up calls we can have is realizing that life is not about us! There are millions of other people sharing life on this planet with whom life celebrate those relationships? The most distracting question we can ask is, "What do I want to do?" The more focused, faith-filled question is, "What do I need to do?" What I need to do



may not be what I want to do. However, asking this question more frequently will teach us how to more purposefully and intentionally live so we can be a life-giving vessel for others. When we learn to live more sacrificially, to put the needs of others before our own, and to not always seek our own self-interest, we become aware of what Baptism into Christ's death is really all about. These are the roots of virtue and the seedbed for justice, tolerance, solidarity, love, and peace.

Learning how to accept all the "small deaths" and sacrifices life calls us to

teaches us how to approach our final death. All deaths ask us to empty ourselves into something or someone else. Whether we empty ourselves into the heart and soul of another human being or empty ourselves into God at the moment of our final death, new life is always received and nurtured. A heart that exclusively seeks its own interest is a heart that is closed to love. A heart that pours itself out to others and is content with being emptied is a heart that has been touched by and open to mercy. It is a heart that overflows with joy.

If you have previously had a child baptized in the Catholic church & would like to schedule a Baptism, send an email to knasdeo@standrewparish.cc. If this is your first child, you will first need to attend a pre-Baptism class, however we do not yet have a date when those will resume. However, you are encouraged to submit a Baptism Registration Form so that you may be contacted when the class schedule opens.


