## FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

I returned from my short vacation about a week ago feeling rested and refreshed. But the heat and humidity this past week has quickly caused me to wilt! I hope all of you are keeping well during these days. Once again, the Coronavirus is on the up-tick, and so we are reminded of the importance of vigilance and protection. The wearing of masks in public places is now mandatory in many jurisdictions, including Franklin County and the City of Columbus. Our Sunday Mass attendance has leveled off, and even declined slightly, in the last two weeks. I take this as an indication that people are being very cautious about joining larger gatherings of people, and that is absolutely the right way to be. I have to be very careful myself because if I should become sick, I would not be able to celebrate Mass and we would be faced with the possibility of suspending public Masses once again. So, let's all be careful and safe, and not let these things happen!

This weekend, we bid farewell to Fr. T.J. Lehigh, who begins his new assignment as Pastor of the Perry County Consortium of Parishes this week. Please see his message in this week's bulletin. I am sorry that, due to the restrictions on gatherings, we cannot give him a proper farewell.

But I do wish to thank him for his ministry these past two years and for his assistance to me and St. Andrew Parish, and to wish him every success in his new assignment.

We also are preparing to welcome Fr. Bill Ferguson, who will arrive here at St. Andrew on Tuesday of this week and begin his service here as our associate pastor. I hope you all will give him a warm welcome.

This weekend also marks the belated kick-off of the 2020 Bishop's Annual Appeal. Like everything else, the BAA was sidelined by the pandemic. Furthermore, many families, businesses, and individuals are struggling financially due to loss of revenue, employment, and income. I want to thank St. Andrew parishioners for your continued support of St. Andrew Parish. Although our offertory donations are down slightly from last year, it is still pretty good, and nowhere near as bad as I feared it might be. I can't thank you enough for your loyalty and sacrifice!

But I also know that this is not a good time to launch the BAA. And yet, the Diocese really needs the funds from the Appeal to carry out its important work. I have often said that the Bishop's Annual Appeal is to the Diocese what the Sunday collection is to the parish. Especially this year, during the pandemic crisis, the support that the Bishop and the diocesan offices and agencies

have given to our parishes, schools, programs, clergy, and laity have been indispensable. We could not have gotten through these past few months without the support of the Diocese of Columbus. And so, we must do our part to support the Diocese through the Bishop's Annual Appeal. St. Andrew Parish has always been generous to the Appeal, and the Bishop continues to count on our support. Last year, we surpassed our goal for the Appeal. I know these are difficult times, but I ask you, please if you are able, to give whatever you gave last year. If your circumstances do not permit this, I understand and do not wish to place an unbearable burden on you. But if you can, please do. This is what I will do also.

## SCHEDULING MASS INTENTIONS

The practice of requesting a Mass to be offered for a loved one – living or deceased – is a beautiful and wonderful part of our Catholic tradition and to ensure all who wish to schedule a Mass for loved ones may do so, a new Mass Intention procedure has been put into effect immediately.

- † All Mass Intention requests should be made in writing or in person (at the present time due to limited office staffing, we are not currently taking in person requests) & must be accompanied by payment. **While you may call or email to check the availability of certain dates or times, requests will not be finalized over the phone and will not be reserved until payment is received.**
- † Request forms are available in the pamphlet racks in the parlor and NW entrance or you may send an email or note (accompanied with payment) with the name(s) of the deceased, dates & times requested and your contact information. Only one intention (person) per Mass is allowed, however for pastoral concerns to better accommodate the needs of parishioners, two first names (David & Catherine Smith) or two last names (Davis & Smith Families) are acceptable.
- † We will do our best to honor the date(s) & times requested, but unfortunately, no date or time can be guaranteed. Once scheduled, we will send a list of the Masses scheduled for your records. You will be sent a confirmation of the date(s) and time(s) of the Mass(es) scheduled. Please allow 5-7 days for processing.
- † Families may schedule up to twelve (12) Masses per year with four (4) of those on weekends. Additional Masses will be accepted, but these will be scheduled when dates are available throughout the year on a rotating basis.
- † A \$10 stipend, as determined by Diocesan policy, is to accompany each Mass request. **Please make check payable to St. Andrew Parish** with Mass Stipend in memo section of check. Payment, along with request form or note with Mass dates/times requested may be placed in an envelope marked "Mass Intentions" & placed in the weekend collection basket or mailed to the parish office at St. Andrew Parish Attn: Mass Intentions, 1899 McCoy Rd., Columbus, OH 43220.

## ST. KATERI TEKAKWITHA

July 14th



More than 300 years ago, around 1656, Kateri lived in what is now the state of New York. Her mother was a Catholic and a member of the Algonquin tribe, and her father was a pagan Mohawk warrior.

When she was just a young child, Kateri's mother and father and brother died of smallpox. The smallpox left scars on Kateri's face and affected her eyesight. She was bullied & rejected by the other children.

When three Jesuit fathers were visiting the tribe in 1667 and staying in the tent of her uncle, they spoke to her of Christ, and though she did not ask to be baptized, she

believed in Jesus with an incredible intensity. She also realized that she was called into an intimate union with God as a consecrated virgin.

Kateri had to struggle to maintain her faith amidst the opposition of her tribe who ridiculed her for it and ostracized her for refusing the marriage that had been planned for her. When she was 18, Fr. Jacques de Lamberville returned to the Mohawk village, and she asked to be baptized. The life of the Mohawk village had become violent and debauchery was commonplace. Realizing that this was proving too dangerous to her life and her call to

perpetual virginity, Kateri escaped to the town of Caughnawaga in Quebec, near Montreal, where she grew in holiness and devotion to the Blessed Sacrament.

Kateri lived out the last years of her short life there, practicing austere penance and constant prayer. She was said to have reached the highest levels of mystical union with God, and many miracles were attributed to her while she was still alive. She died on April 17, 1680 at the age of 24. Witnesses reported that within minutes of her death, the scars from smallpox completely vanished and her face shone with radiant beauty.




When I was a child, my mother had a set of sculptures resembling three human heads. One head had hands over the ears, one had hands over the eyes, and one had hands over the mouth. Of course, they depicted the phrase, "Hear no evil; see no evil; speak no evil." I have seen these images repeated many times since then, usually as the monkey heads from a Japanese proverb, which would have probably seemed a little less creepy to me when I was a small child. These gifts of God are big and little, profound and ordinary. By seeing the world in this way, we begin to change our personalities and our overall disposition. We always need to follow a new proverb: see all the good, hear all the good, and speak about the good. Amen.

## WHY DO WE DO THAT?

Catholic Life Explained:

### Why do Catholics Baptize Babies?

For adults who want to be baptized, the celebration only takes place after a long, guided, and thoughtful process through the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. This is also true for many Protestant Christians, who are baptized later in life, often after a personal, transforming religious experience. So, it seems fair to ask why our Catholic tradition includes infant Baptism. After all, if we make adults who want to become Catholic wait months and even years as they grow in their understanding of Christ and his teachings, why should babies — who "do nothing" — be baptized?

Our custom of infant Baptism dates back to the earliest days of the Church, when St. Paul baptized entire households, including, we presume, children (see Acts 16:15, 33; 18:8). That had become common practice by the second century. When Christianity was legalized 200 years later, infant Baptism became the normal practice throughout the Church. We recognize that in Baptism, we are given the grace to overcome original sin — the human tendency to choose ourselves and our own wills over God — and to become members of the Church. This is the gift we give to infants in Baptism.

In its essence, the Baptism of infants also reminds us adult Christians that the gift of salvation and membership in the Church (i.e., the Body of Christ) is God's initiative. It is freely offered to us, regardless of where we might be in life's journey. Salvation isn't something we earn. Instead, we see that Baptism is the beginning of a lifelong process of growing into the kind of disciples that Jesus wants us to be.




