FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners:

The second Tuesday of July has come and gone -- which means the new assignments of priests have taken effect. Our new Parochial Vicar, Fr. William Ferguson, has arrived and taken up his post. I am sure you will get acquainted with him over time. Since we are still being cautious about attending Mass, it may be a while before many of you meet him in person, but you will in due time. I am grateful to have Fr. Ferguson's assistance with the care of souls of St. Andrew Parish!

Several of our neighboring parishes also have new priests assigned to them. St. Timothy's new pastor is Fr. David Poliafico; St. Agatha's new pastor is Fr. Mark Summers; St. Peter's new pastor is Fr. Chris Tuttle; and Fr. Frank Brown is the new Parochial Vicar at St. Brendan's. There are many other new assignments around the Diocese that are also taking effect at this time. And while you still have the same old pastor here at St. Andrew (and I am very happy to be continuing

as such), I do want to mention some changes which will be affecting me more directly, and which will lighten my workload somewhat. First of all, with the appointment of Fr. Hilary Ike to St. Mary Parish in Groveport, I no longer have a responsibility as Priest-Moderator for that parish. Also, you may have seen the recent announcement that the Diocese of Columbus has hired Laura Lewis to serve as the new Victim's Assistance Coordinator. She is replacing me in this role, one that I have fulfilled for the last 17 years and which has consumed much of my time and energy. I am very relieved to be handing over these duties and responsibilities!

Finally, Fr. Michael Hartge has been appointed as Vice-Chancellor of the Diocese. He will be working with me, Deacon Tom Berg, Jr. (Chancellor) and Bishop Brennan in the Chancery Office. Although my work as Vicar General will continue and I will still be working many hours at the Chancery each week, having Fr. Hartge on the team will be a great help to me. All of these assignments are good news. I feel very fortunate and blessed. Knowing that there is a severe shortage of priests,

I am particularly grateful that Bishop Brennan assigned Fr. Ferguson to St. Andrew with me to serve you and minister to the needs of our parish.

On another note, I am sure that many of you, like me, are experiencing "Coronavirus Fatigue." We are tired of it all. We wonder if the restrictions will ever end, and each day our hope is diminished as the return to normalcy becomes ever more distant. As the number of cases rises, our fear of becoming ill ourselves increases. This starts to affect our outlook and we become frustrated and edgy. Some people appear to lose their minds completely and throw caution to the wind, reject social distancing, and refuse to wear masks! How important it is for us to seek the virtues of prudence and patience! Clearly, we are in this for the long haul. We must pace ourselves, and taking Christ as our model, remain faithful, docile, obedient, and hopeful as we persevere through every difficulty.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God - it is right and just!



SCHEDULING MASS INTENTIONS

The practice of requesting a Mass to be offered for a loved one – living or deceased – is a beautiful and wonderful part of our Catholic tradition and to ensure all who wish to schedule a Mass for loved ones may do so, **a new Mass Intention procedure has been put into effect immediately.**

- † All Mass Intention requests should be made in writing or in person (at the present time due to limited office staffing, we are not currently taking in person requests) & must be accompanied by payment. **While you may call or email to check the availability of certain dates or times, requests will not be finalized over the phone and will not be reserved until payment is received.**
- † Request forms are available in the pamphlet racks in the parlor and NW entrance or you may send an email or note (accompanied with payment) with the name(s) of the deceased, dates & times requested and your contact information. Only one intention (person) per Mass is allowed, however for pastoral concerns to better accommodate the needs of parishioners, two first names (David & Catherine Smith) or two last names (Davis & Smith Families) are acceptable.
- † We will do our best to honor the date(s) & times requested, but unfortunately, no date or time can be guaranteed. Once scheduled, we will send a list of the Masses scheduled for your records. You will be sent a confirmation of the date(s) and time(s) of the Mass(es) scheduled. Please allow 5-7 days for processing.
- † Families may schedule up to twelve (12) Masses per year with four (4) of those on weekends. Additional Masses will be accepted, but these will be scheduled when dates are available throughout the year on a rotating basis.
- † A \$10 stipend, as determined by Diocesan policy, is to accompany each Mass request. **Please make check payable to St. Andrew Parish** with Mass Stipend in memo section of check. Payment, along with request form or note with Mass dates/times requested may be placed in an envelope marked "Mass Intentions" & placed in the weekend collection basket or mailed to the parish office at St. Andrew Parish Attn: Mass Intentions, 1899 McCoy Rd., Columbus, OH 43220.

A friend recently confided in me that although he prayed frequently each day and was involved heavily in his parish, he did not sense much fruit coming from it all and was left feeling unsatisfied. I assured him he was not alone. I told him of a deceased pastor of mine who had spoken frequently about being in this type of situation. Even as a priest, he knew all too well of how we can feel like we are simply going through the motions. It is precisely at those times that continuing to pray and practicing good stewardship is most important, because it would be easier to simply take a break and risk never coming back. He liked to say, "Do the drill," meaning just do what needs to be done.

We are all called to be mature disciples who answer the call of Jesus Christ regardless of the cost. We cannot choose when and where the call will come. We cannot schedule our stewardship in a way that is always most convenient for us. Even when the fruits of our faithful efforts seem hidden from us, we hold to the promise that we are never called to give of ourselves for nothing. God is working through us and in us. No matter how dry the land may seem, seeds are being planted to yield a harvest greater than we can ever realize. Stay strong and do the drill!

WHY DO WE DO THAT?

Catholic Life Explained:

WHY DO CATHOLICS EAT FISH ON FRIDAY?

For centuries, meatless Fridays were the norm for Catholics throughout the world. Friday was chosen because that was the day on which Jesus died, and Christians wanted to find a way to honor that day with special prayers and acts of penance and self-denial. The practice of abstaining from meat on Fridays — under pain of sin — grew out of that desire, and it became an official part of Church teaching until the time of the Second Vatican Council.

In the 1960s, there was a shift in the Church's thinking, in large part because there was a recognition that differences in cultures and economic realities meant that eating or not eating meat had different meanings for different peoples. For example, in cultures that were largely dependent on seafood or a vegetarian diet, abstaining from meat was no sacrifice at all. While in other places, eating fish and other kinds of seafood was actually something rare and special and not a sacrifice. This was all part of a basic reflection on "why we do what we do" among the Church's pastors.

Today, Catholics throughout the world are still instructed to abstain from meat on the Fridays of Lent. The bishops of some countries, such as in England and Wales, ask Catholics to abstain from meat every Friday, continuing the older tradition. The Bishops of the United States have taken a slightly different approach, encouraging Catholics to honor Friday as a special day by abstaining from meat every Friday or by taking on some other work of penance or charity for the sake of others. Regardless of what we choose to do, the real value in all of this is to see a reflection of Good Friday in each Friday, to remember the self-giving love of Jesus, and to honor that love through some sort of sacrifice or act of mercy.

GOSPEL MEDITATION

ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

Grace and sin, belief and unbelief, good and evil all exist together. While we wrestle with these two dimensions of reality inwardly, they are also witnessed in the actions and words of others. Many, all too often, beat themselves up because of their sin. We are also all too quick to pass judgment on others whom we perceive to be in error and walking down a wrong path. God does not make rash judgments, nor should we. Patience is the order of the day as is an understanding that God is ultimately the caller of the shots.


Our faith tells us that while God allows the wheat and the weeds to coexist, the wheat will always triumph. As long as we can cultivate even a little faith and a small measure of desire for God, He can produce abundant blessings and good things. Even when the weeds seem to have triumphed, there still may be a small measure of faith remaining that can be cultivated and grown. It doesn't take much! Unless a person totally allows the weeds to

reign, there is always to be found at least a small measure of faith, good, light, and love. With even this small portion, God can produce abundant growth.

Admittedly, it is easy to give into the weeds, and they grow very quickly. Any gardener knows this to be true. Sometimes, the weeds even seem more attractive and vibrant. Dealing with weeds can quickly become a losing battle, and they can look healthier and grow faster than the very plants we are trying to protect. It's easy to give into them and let them win.

While God will deal with all things in due time, we are responsible for keeping things in check in the short term. It is our task to keep our eyes fixed on God's presence and mercy.

We are asked to avoid judgment. And, it is not our responsibility to deal with the weeds in someone else's garden, only our own. One garden is enough responsibility for anyone. Weeds have power. We have to realize this.



While they can appear attractive and healthy, they can quickly choke us off from God's presence. Our task is one of maintenance and cultivating a desire for God. Even the smallest kernel of faith can grow into something wonderful. In God's time, the eternal harvest will come, and we will no longer have to worry about the weeds.



St. Sharbel Makhluf

Feast Day July 24

Although this saint never traveled far from the Lebanese village of Beka-Kafra where he was born, his influence has

spread widely. Joseph Zaroun Maklouf was raised by an uncle because his father, a mule driver, died when Joseph was only three. At the age of 23, Joseph joined the Monastery of St. Maron at Annaya, Lebanon, and took the name Sharbel in honor of a second-century martyr. He professed his final vows in 1853, and was ordained six years later.

Following the example of the fifth-century Saint Maron, Sharbel lived as a hermit from 1875, until his death. His reputation for holiness prompted people to seek him to receive a blessing and to be remembered in his prayers. He followed a strict fast and was very devoted to the Blessed Sacrament. When his superiors occasionally asked him to administer the sacraments to nearby villages, Sharbel did so gladly.

He died in the late afternoon on Christmas Eve. Christians and non-Christians soon made his tomb a place of pilgrimage and of cures. Pope Paul VI beatified Sharbel in 1965, and canonized him 12 years later.

St. John Paul II often said that the Church has two lungs—East and West—and it must learn to breathe using both of them. Remembering saints like Sharbel helps the Church to appreciate both the diversity and unity present in the Catholic Church. Like all the saints, Sharbel points us to God and invites us to cooperate generously with God's grace, no matter what our situation in life may be. As our prayer life becomes deeper and more honest, we become more ready to make that generous response.
