## FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners:

This Sunday, we celebrate the Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time. That doesn't really sound very special, does it? This season of the church year is very – "ordinary." It seems rather exaggerated to say we "celebrate" such an ordinary occasion. There are thirty-four weeks of "Ordinary Time" in the church's yearly calendar. So this Seventeenth Sunday marks the middle of the season. We are also in the middle of Summer. And we are still in the middle of the year 2020, a year like no other. We have been through a lot this year, and there is more to come.

All of this made me think about the passage of time. Just as the

year is a continuum of time which goes from beginning to end, from season to season, so, too, is our life. Where are you on that continuum? Spring, Summer, Fall, or Winter? I don't know about you, but I feel like I am right smack in the middle of "ordinary time." I am beginning my eighth year as Pastor of St. Andrew Parish, and I am hoping for at least six more. I often have to remind myself of what year it is, and that I am 64 years old. It is later than I think it is. I may not be as young as I used to be, but I still want to take each day as it comes.

There is a psalm that says, "Teach us to number our days aright, that we may gain wisdom of heart." I think that is a very good prayer for us on this Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time. So often, we are so busy looking ahead, planning the next thing, striving for some future

goal, asking "what's next," that we fail to live in the present moment. We do not live THIS DAY fully or appreciate it. All of our past days have brought us to the present and our experiences remain a part of us. But we shouldn't dwell on or brood over the past. We can't turn the clock back. Wherever we find ourselves on the continuum of life, remember, God has brought you to this day. This day is unique. This day is God's gift to you. Live it fully. You can appreciate your past and the wisdom you have acquired. You can look with hope for your future, which is hidden. But today, THIS DAY, is for living and doing and experiencing now – even if it is only "ordinary time."

## SCHEDULING MASS INTENTIONS

The practice of requesting a Mass to be offered for a loved one – living or deceased – is a beautiful and wonderful part of our Catholic tradition and to ensure all who wish to schedule a Mass for loved ones may do so, a new Mass Intention procedure has been put into effect immediately.

- † All Mass Intention requests should be made in writing or in person (at the present time due to limited office staffing, we are not currently taking in person requests) & must be accompanied by payment. **While you may call or email to check the availability of certain dates or times, requests will not be finalized over the phone and will not be reserved until payment is received.**
- † Request forms are available in the pamphlet racks in the parlor and NW entrance or you may send an email or note (accompanied with payment) with the name (s) of the deceased, dates & times requested and your contact information. Only one intention (person) per Mass is allowed, however for pastoral concerns to better accommodate the needs of parishioners, two first names (David & Catherine Smith) or two last names (Davis & Smith Families) are acceptable.
- † We will do our best to honor the date(s) & times requested, but unfortunately, no date or time can be guaranteed. Once scheduled, we will send a list of the Masses scheduled for your records. You will be sent a confirmation of the date(s) and time(s) of the Mass (es) scheduled. Please allow 5-7 days for processing.
- † Families may schedule up to twelve (12) Masses per year with four (4) of those on weekends. Additional Masses will be accepted, but these will be scheduled when dates are available throughout the year on a rotating basis.
- † A \$10 stipend, as determined by Diocesan policy, is to accompany each Mass request. **Please make check payable to St. Andrew Parish** with Mass Stipend in memo section of check. Payment, along with request form or note with Mass dates/times requested may be placed in an envelope marked "Mass Intentions" & placed in the weekend collection basket or mailed to the parish office at St. Andrew Parish Attn: Mass Intentions, 1899 McCoy Rd., Columbus, OH 43220.


I am very happy to be here at St. Andrew, and I look forward to meeting you all and getting involved with the pastoral work of the parish. It actually is a "second round" for me, of sorts, as I was assigned here 15 years ago as a Deacon during my final year of seminary. I remember fondly coming here on weekends to assist with Masses, Adoration, and Stations, as well as doing Baptisms, and I am happy to return here to familiar surroundings.

In the intervening years, I have served at a number of parishes, including as Pastor not only as Buckeye Lake's Our Lady of Mt. Carmel, but also at Heath's St. Leonard (with whom Buckeye Lake was eventually clustered), as well as Pastor of Logan's St. John, and most recently, as Pastor of the cluster of parishes of Hardin County (Ada & Kenton). With the approval of Bishop Brennan, I am currently taking a "break" from "pastoring" parishes in order to begin some certification studies through the "Theology of the Body Institute" in Philadelphia, with the hope of eventually serving in some form of teaching role in this and/or other topics. In my years as a priest, I have come to enjoy teaching in various settings, helping parishioners to come to learn and experience more deeply the beauty, wisdom, and love of God that our Catholic faith has to offer us as disciples, especially given the

challenges we face in living our faith in the current culture. To that end, I look forward to being very engaged in parish life during my time here at St. Andrew's, and I invite everyone to contact me for whatever spiritual needs you may have. I am here to serve.

In terms of my personal background, I am a native of upstate New York (i.e., a 'refugee' from bad winters...), but I have been in Ohio since 1995 when I moved here to attend graduate school. In my "previous life," I was an environmental groundwater geologist, and I was called to the priesthood after some years of professional work. I have interests in family history (yes, I am one of those strange people who plans vacations around visits to old cemeteries...), as well as hiking and camping. I also have a cat named "Jackie" (a surprise gift to me by some youth group members 12 years ago), who has been known to write bulletin columns for the children in my previous parishes (which habitually got more attention than my own columns!).

Recognize God in Your Ordinary Moments

## WHAT IS GOD ASKING OF YOU?

What are you willing to give for the sake of the kingdom of God? Often, we begin a discussion like this with a story or a few leading thoughts. However, if we are to be serious about who we claim to be as Christians, there should be no beating around the bush. Then there are those who seem to take faith for granted, and because little is asked by their friends or parish, they give nothing. It is quite a contrast of situations.

On this day, it may seem like little is being asked of you and I by God. Is that because we aren't being asked or because we aren't listening? If you are counting on me and I am on you; we should figure this out sooner than later. Of course, I suspect we actually do know the answer, don't we?

## WHY DO WE DO THAT?

## WHY DO CATHOLICS LIGHT CANDLES IN CHURCH?

Candles have been part of the Church's worship from the earliest times. In the days before electricity, candles and oil lamps were the ways that people lighted buildings. Even today, we often still depend on candles during power outages, relying on their flickering flames to bring light into the dark.

Like our ancestors, we also light candles on special occasions. Think about a festive family meal or a romantic dinner for two — there will often be candles on the table, special objects for a special event. We light candles on birthday cakes and carry them in processions. We also place candles at makeshift memorials that appear when there has been an accident or act of violence. In these moments, their light casts aside a different kind of darkness — the darkness of grief, fear, and death.

The custom of the early Christians lighting candles and lamps at the tombs of the martyrs gave way to the practice of having candles at Mass, honoring the sacredness of the celebration.

As Christians decorated their worship spaces with statues and icons, they would burn candles in front of sacred images and the relics of the saints, basically "shining a light" on what they held to be sacred. When pilgrims would visit these shrines, they would often bring candles to light before the image or relic. These candles came to be a symbol of the person, and their prayer and the burning of these candles came to be understood as an extension and continuation of the prayer that was offered. What began as a practical way to provide light has come to be a symbol of the hopes, desires, loves, losses, fears, and faith of everyday Christians offering their prayers to God and his saints.

## GOSPEL MEDITATION


### ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

A single mother who has a child with special needs works two jobs and sacrifices much of her own pleasures in order to be available for her son. Being the best mother possible is important to her and brings her joy. We are willing to make great and often heroic sacrifices for those people and things that matter most to us. Unless there is something of obvious importance to us in our immediate path, we can easily approach life in a more haphazard and chaotic way. We jump from one thing to another, responding to whatever it is that is competing for our attention at that moment. When everything is important, nothing is important.

If we do not wear the right pair of glasses, we can get all too easily caught up in the superficial stuff and neglect paying attention to the things that really matter. The kingdom of God is like the pearl of great price that is worth selling everything for so that it can be obtained. Based on

where I invest my time and energy each day, I really wonder whether I am serving God's kingdom or my own. Have you ever considered tracking how you spend your time? You may be surprised! We allow our agendas to set the clock of our lives. We forget that joy and a true sense of purpose are not going to be found in following that timepiece. Joy is the expression of the happiness that is discovered when living in the kingdom of God. When our agenda matches God, not only do we leap for joy, but God leaps with delight as well. Our well-being is what matters most to God.

Can you imagine God delighting in you? It is easy to deaden our senses to the whole reality of God and the joy that living the Gospel can bring. The demands of secular life and the agendas competing for our



attention can quickly do that. We can get tired and spiritually apathetic. But if we can see our way through all of the conflicting voices and hear the voice of God, we can rediscover our zeal and passion and redirect our efforts. When we begin to see as God sees, we can rise each day and notice what really needs our attention and embrace it with exuberance. Be careful, though. It may not be what we originally had on our list. Responding to it, however, will be worth putting everything else aside.


