FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners:

We are coming up on the middle of August, normally an eventful and exciting time of year here at St. Andrew Parish. This year, however, mid-August is much less eventful and much more uncertain. This is the time when the preparation for our Festival would normally be in high gear. But as you know, the Festival at St. Andrew has been canceled this year. So, there are no tents going up, no raffle tickets being sold, no cakes and pies being dropped off. It is easy to understand that canceling the Festival was the right decision, as the Coronavirus is still spreading. But we miss this opportunity for fun and socializing with friends and fellow parishioners. When I was on vacation back in June, I visited a parish in Lima, Ohio, and it was at the time they would have been having their annual festival. The pastor suggested in the Sunday bulletin that parishioners

might make a donation to the parish equivalent to what they would have spent at the parish festival if it had been held. I thought that was a good idea and so I share it with you. It won't be as fun as buying a silent auction item or taking chances on the raffle or playing games or buying delicious grilled foods--but you can pretend! For the last several years, my dog Mabel has been a festival bench sponsor. She is going to make an equivalent donation to St. Andrew this year also. I hope you will consider doing something similar.

This is also the time of year when we are getting ready for school to start. This year, the opening of school is a matter of great uncertainty and anxiety. Throughout the summer, St. Andrew School has been preparing for school to open with in-school instruction for all students. Extra classroom space has been created in order to provide distancing and separation and various virus mitigation protocols will be in place. We are still intending for such, but we

recognize that we may be forced into another option, hence our uncertainty and anxiety! No matter what happens, we have to trust that we are doing everything necessary for the safety and health of our students and staff.

This Saturday, August 15, is the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Of course, it is NOT a Holy Day of Obligation this year, both because it falls on a Saturday, and because the obligation of attending Mass on Sundays and holy days has been dispensed until further notice due to the pandemic. But we will still celebrate this feast at 9:00 a.m. Mass on Saturday. Traditionally, the Feast of the Assumption was the time to bless produce from farms and gardens. This is the time when our gardens are bearing fruit. That should bring some joy and satisfaction in these otherwise uneventful and uncertain days!

SCHEDULING MASS INTENTIONS

The practice of requesting a Mass to be offered for a loved one – living or deceased – is a beautiful and wonderful part of our Catholic tradition and to ensure all who wish to schedule a Mass for loved ones may do so, a new Mass Intention procedure has been put into effect immediately.

- † All Mass Intention requests should be made in writing or in person (at the present time due to limited office staffing, we are not currently taking in-person requests) & must be accompanied by payment. **While you may call or email to check the availability of certain dates or times, requests will not be finalized over the phone and will not be reserved until payment is received.**
- † Request forms are available in the pamphlet racks in the parlor and NW entrance or you may send an email or note (accompanied with payment) with the name (s) of the deceased, dates & times requested and your contact information. Only one intention (person) per Mass is allowed, however for pastoral concerns to better accommodate the needs of parishioners, two first names (David & Catherine Smith) or two last names (Davis & Smith Families) are acceptable.
- † We will do our best to honor the date (s) & times requested, but unfortunately, no date or time can be guaranteed. Once scheduled, we will send a list of the Masses scheduled for your records. You will be sent a confirmation of the date (s) and time (s) of the Mass (es) scheduled. Please allow 5-7 days for processing.
- † Families may schedule up to twelve (12) Masses per year with four (4) of those on weekends. Additional Masses will be accepted, but these will be scheduled when dates are available throughout the year on a rotating basis.
- † A \$10 stipend, as determined by Diocesan policy, is to accompany each Mass request. **Please make check payable to St. Andrew Parish** with Mass Stipend in memo section of check. Payment, along with request form or note with Mass dates/times requested may be placed in an envelope marked "Mass Intentions" & placed in the weekend collection basket or mailed to the parish office at St. Andrew Parish, Attn: Mass Intentions, 1899 McCoy Rd., Columbus, OH 43220.

YOUTH MINISTRY



Hello! I hope you are all having a wonderful Summer!!!! I wanted to announce our new High School Ministry Program called Godteens here at St. Andrew!!! The Godteens ministry is something I grew up with at my home parish in Nebraska and was the coordinator for back in Nebraska a few years ago and I am excited to bring this format to St. Andrews this year! What is different about Godteens is that it is a very small group focused and based off of student's grade levels!! I think it allows for some more deep discussion and fellowship among smaller groups of students and I think this format will work very well in the COVID world we are currently living in because it is all small group based!

What is Godteens?

Each high school student that signs up will

be assigned to a small group with two Godparent Leaders (one adult male and one adult female) for the year based off of their high school grade level! They will meet in their HS Godteen Group two to three times a month starting in September-May. Once a month, all the Godteen Groups will meet together either virtually or in person depending on COVID!

Where will Godteens meet?

Depending on COVID this year, these meetings can be virtual Zoom or in person, COVID permitting.

When will Godteens meet? 6:30-8pm on Sundays. If there are a lot of conflicts for students at this time, we can look at arranging other HS Godteen groups on different evenings and times if there is enough interest. Once a month, all the Godteen Groups will meet together either virtually or in person depending on COVID!

Who are Godparents?

We are looking for at least four couples to be Godparent Leaders together. You do not need to be married or dating. It could be just an adult man and a woman who are good friends. We would like one adult woman and one adult man per group together, at least 18 years or older and a high school graduate. We are looking for adults who love Jesus and their Catholic faith, love to have lots of fun and who are excited to share the Catholic faith with the next generation! All Godparents will need to have completed the Protecting God's Children Training and background

check. My husband and I were Godparent leaders together for a few years and it was a lot of fun to do together and really good for our marriage! If you have young kids, they are welcome to join in with you and do not feel like you need to have a babysitter each week in order to serve as a godparent. Exposing teens to what a true Catholic married and family life looks like with your children can be a super cool part of your ministry.

What will we talk about in Godteens?

The cool part about Godteens is that you can focus on what you and your small group would like to study and learn more deeply about. It could be a particular Bible Study, book study, apologetics, salvation history, Worship, Marian Concentration, Theology of the Body, Y Disciple etc. Godparents will meet with Andrea and discuss different options on what their small group would like to focus on throughout the year!!! Since every group will be very different, we will cater to what your individual small group would like to focus on!



WHY DO WE DO THAT?

Catholic Life Explained:

WHY DOES MARY HAVE SO MANY FEAST DAYS AND NAMES?

Christians first began celebrating feast days in honor of Mary, the Mother of Jesus, in the fifth century. That celebration (originally called the Feast of the Dormition and now known by Roman Catholics as the Solemnity of the Assumption) was celebrated on August 15. Very soon, however, other special days dedicated to Mary began to appear in Jerusalem, Rome, and other major cities of the Christian world. These days of feasting became important parts of the life of the community. But, more importantly, each of these unique celebrations became an opportunity to focus on a different facet of the Christian faith, as believers focused their attention on specific events or mysteries of the lives of Mary and her Son.


Over the centuries, some of these celebrations became universal (such as the Assumption on August 15, the Immaculate Conception on December 8, and the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God on January 1). Other celebrations were more closely tied to certain religious orders (such as the Carmelites celebration of "Our Lady of Mount Carmel" on July 16 or the Servite Friars feast of the "Seven Sorrows of Mary," which is now celebrated as the Memorial of Our Lady of Sorrows on September 15).

In more recent times, Marian apparitions (like Guadalupe, Lourdes, and Fatima) have inspired special liturgical celebrations. Pope Francis has added two new celebrations of Mary to the Church's calendar: The Memorial of Mary, Mother of the Church (on the Monday after Pentecost) and the Commemoration of Our Lady of Loreto (on December 10). The various titles of Mary (like those we find in the Litany of the Blessed Virgin Mary) help us to reflect on different aspects of Mary's faith and the ways that the Holy Spirit is at work in her and through her, especially as the Mother of Jesus.

In the end, whatever the event or mystery being celebrated in a particular liturgy or the title of Mary being used, we are invited to always see Mary in connection with the saving work of her Son. She is, of course, a patroness and protector for every Christian, but she is also a model of discipleship and contemplation: "Having entered deeply into the history of salvation, Mary, in a way, unites in her person and re-echoes the most important doctrines of the faith: and when she is the subject of preaching and worship, she prompts the faithful to come to her Son, to his sacrifice and to the love of the Father" (Lumen Gentium, 65).


