THE PASTOR

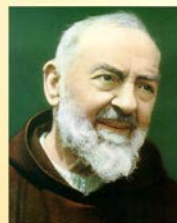
Dear Parishioners:

This is Labor Day Weekend – the unofficial end of Summer. Although the weather will still be summer-like for several more weeks, the carefree, relaxed days of Summer “vacation” are ended – if we even had any such days this year! This Summer of 2020 has been anything but carefree and relaxing. We have been dealing with Coronavirus all Summer and trying to avoid becoming ill. We have been living in fear, staying home, keeping our distance, isolating ourselves, wearing masks, avoiding crowds, sanitizing our hands, and trying to avoid touching anything. We have been missing ordinary human contact and the company of friends and neighbors. We missed going to our favorite vacation destinations, entertainment venues and other fun attractions. Our favorite parades and festivals and community events were cancelled. Instead of having fun and good times, we worried about contagious disease, about systemic racism,

about economic hardship, about injustice and about tension, strife and violence in our cities. We worried about our jobs, our financial security and our families. I worry that the effect of all this prolonged fear and uncertainty is that many are feeling overwhelmed, despairing and hopeless.

Prayer lightens our burdens and eases our troubled minds. Prayer enables us to surrender to God, to trust in His care, and to grow in the virtue of Hope. Prayer makes things better. As this strange and distressing Summer comes to an end, I prescribe a generous dose of prayer. It is medicine for your soul and a pain-reliever for your mind. And I promise you, you will feel better.

The practice of requesting a Mass to be offered for a loved one – living or deceased – is a beautiful and wonderful part of our Catholic tradition and to ensure all who wish to schedule a Mass for loved ones may do so, **please note our Mass Intention Policy:**

- † All Mass Intention requests should be made in writing must be accompanied by payment. While you may call or email to check the availability of certain dates or times, requests will not be finalized and will not be reserved until payment is received.
- † A \$10 stipend, as determined by Diocesan policy, is to accompany each Mass request.
- † Only one intention (person) per Mass is permitted, however for pastoral concerns to better accommodate the needs of parishioners, two first names (David & Catherine Smith) or two last names (Davis & Smith Families) are acceptable.
- † Once scheduled, we will send a list of the Masses scheduled for your records. Please allow 5-7 days.
- † Families may schedule up to twelve (12) Masses per year with four (4) of those on weekends. Additional Masses will be accepted, but these will be scheduled when dates are available throughout the year on a rotating basis.
- † Questions? Please email the parish secretary at knasdeo@standrewparish.cc or call the parish office at 614-451-4290.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT UPCOMING PSR CLASSES

PSR for students in **Grades 1-5** begins **Wednesday, September 9th**.

Classes will start remotely at 4:30 p.m. Catechists have been advised to alter the length of their classes according to grade levels.

Classes for grades 6th, 7th and 8th will begin on Sunday, **September 13th** and will start remotely at 6:30 p.m. and will normally last 40 minutes.

Middle School Youth Ministry will also be remote.

Grade levels are scheduled on various Sundays for Youth Ministry—please consult your calendars. Youth Ministry will also begin at 6:30p.m.

Catechists at each grade level will be contacting their students remotely to connect them to their virtual classes.

Registrations for PSR are still being accepted. Parents have the option of enrolling their student for remote learning or home schooling with these exceptions:

Students in second grade preparing for First Reconciliation and First Communion are to be catechized within community—that is within the group that is preparing for First

Communion. The same is true for Confirmation in 8th grade.

If you are planning on home schooling your child—that is, teaching them yourself, you are required to use materials provided by the Religious Education Office and there is a nominal fee for the materials and the home schooling process of \$125.00. You should complete the regular registration forms, send them in and we will contact you to pick up the materials you need.

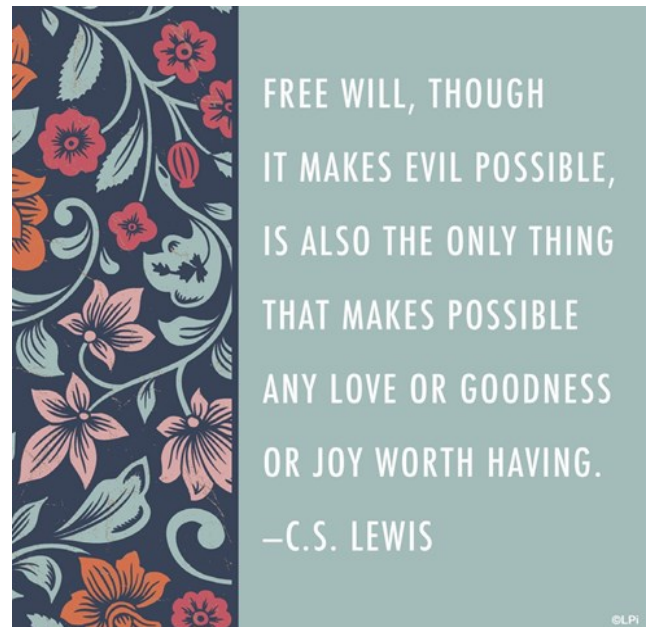
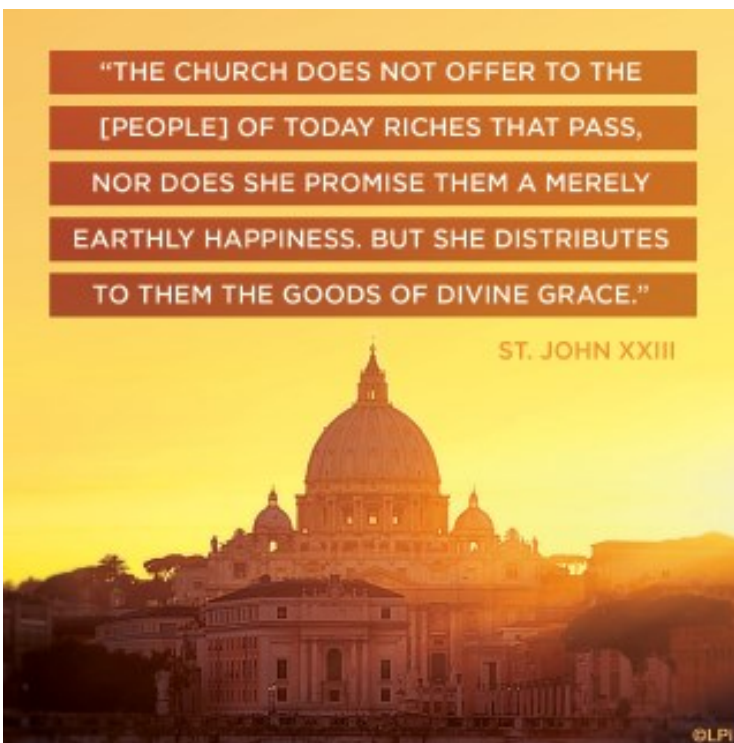

ARE CATHOLICS ALLOWED TO DONATE THEIR ORGANS?

Yes, Catholics are allowed to donate their organs. In fact, the Catechism of the Catholic Church praises this practice when it notes that, "Organ donation after death is a noble and meritorious act and is to be encouraged as an expression of generous solidarity" (no. 2296).


The Church has a series of guidelines for health care providers called The Ethical and Religious Directives for Catholic Health Services.

This document helps us see organ donation as an act of charity, but it also reminds us that we have to be sure that donations of organs by living donors do not "sacrifice or seriously impair any essential bodily function and the anticipated benefit to the

recipient is proportionate to the harm to the donor" (no. 30); trained medical professionals can help to make this assessment. In the case of organ donation at the end of life, we must be sure of the intentions of the donor or of their proxy are always respected, and that the dignity of the human body is always respected.

In the end, we can look to Pope Saint John Paul II and his encyclical *Evangelium Vitae*, where he noted that organ donation is a beautiful act of expressing the culture of life, when "performed in an ethically acceptable manner, with a view to offering a chance of health or even of life itself to the sick who sometimes have no other hope" (no. 86).



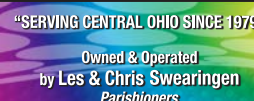
