LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners:

I have been thinking about the entrances to our beautiful church of St. Andrew during this time that we continue to follow our safety protocols in order to minimize the spread of the COVID-19 virus. I would like to share some of my observations with you. I have been observing how our rituals have changed --how we come and go, how we enter and leave. First of all, let me say that our attendance at Sunday Mass has been rather consistent these last couple of months, and is about one-third of "pre-COVID" attendance. October is the month when we take the official "October Count" of attendance, which I am sure will confirm this. I mention this because I know that many who are reading this have not returned to Mass as yet, and that is probably a wise decision. But I realize that many of you have not been present at church to observe with your own eyes how different things are from "normal," so I hope my description is helpful and my observations are meaningful. I was noticing how everyone, men, women, and children, goes straight to the hand sanitizer dispenser on entering the church. Bravo! That is exactly what we all should do. A few people still reach for the Holy Water font, but most don't bother because they know they are dry and empty so as not to spread the virus.

I began to think that maybe I should bless the hand sanitizer, inasmuch as the ritual of using it before entering the church has replaced the ritual of blessing ourselves with holy water as a reminder of our Baptism when we made our original "entrance" into the Church.

I have also been observing and reflecting upon our open doors. Since the church reopened after the shutdown, we have the doors standing wide open before, during, and after Mass. This is so no one has to touch a door handle to enter the church. But the open doors have great symbolic value also. They say "Welcome! Come in!" They remind us that Christ has opened the gates of heaven for us, which had been closed and barred after the sin of our first parents. It is good to see those open doors, especially when I think back to the time earlier this year when the church was closed and locked for almost three months. With the weather turning colder, there may be some who think we should close the doors, but they will stay open so that the fresh air will help to disperse the virus. So, dress warmly when you come to church this Fall and Winter.

Whether you are coming through the doors of our church or are still waiting until it is safer to do so, I hope this little reflection helps you appreciate our "entrance" into the Church!

SCHEDULING MASS INTENTIONS

The practice of requesting a Mass to be offered for a loved one – living or deceased – is a beautiful and wonderful part of our Catholic tradition and to ensure all who wish to schedule a Mass for loved ones may do so, please note our Mass Intention Policy:

- † All Mass Intention requests should be made in writing must be accompanied by payment. While you may call or email to check the availability of certain dates or times, requests will not be finalized and will not be reserved until payment is received.
- † Only one intention (person) per Mass is permitted, however for pastoral concerns to better accommodate the needs of parishioners, two first names (David & Catherine Smith) or two last names (Davis & Smith Families) are acceptable.
- † Once scheduled, we will send a list of the Masses scheduled for your records. **Please allow 5-7 days for processing from the date your request was received.**
- † Families may schedule up to twelve (12) Masses per year with four (4) of those on weekends. Additional Masses will be accepted, but these will be scheduled when dates are available throughout the year on a rotating basis.

QUESTION: Why do Catholics genuflect?

Answer:

Genuflection is an act of devotion that literally means “to bend the knee.” For many Catholics, it’s an almost automatic gesture that we perform before entering our pew or row of seats at Mass. But, like many of the symbols and gestures of our faith tradition, genuflecting can also be an invitation for deeper reflection.

The practice of “bending the knee” is an ancient way of recognizing the presence of someone greater than we are. It has been said that the practice dates back to the time of Alexander the Great, but it became a common part of etiquette in the royal courts of the Middle Ages. From throne rooms and palaces, it was a small step to genuflecting becoming part of the devotional lives of Christians, who used this secular gesture as a way of recognizing the presence of the One who is King of Kings, especially in the Eucharist.

Today, Catholics are asked to genuflect in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament (whether in the tabernacle or exposed on the altar during Eucharistic Adoration). So, while it has become second nature to genuflect before entering your seat in church, we should pay attention to where the Blessed Sacrament is kept in each church or chapel that we visit, and genuflect in the direction of the tabernacle where the Blessed Sacrament is kept. In churches or chapels in which the tabernacle is in a separate space, we are invited to simply bow toward the altar.

In addition to genuflecting before the Blessed Sacrament, we are also instructed to genuflect before the cross used for veneration on Good Friday (during the solemn celebrations of the Lord’s Passion) and any time a relic of the True Cross is displayed for veneration. This long-standing tradition is a way of honoring the cross as the great sign of our salvation and of showing devotion to the passion of Jesus.


