LETTER THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners:

The beginning of Advent is still two weeks away, but I want to share with you some plans we are making for the celebration of Christmas here at St. Andrew Parish.

First of all, thank you to all who participated in our survey regarding your intentions for attending Mass for the feast of Christmas. Your responses have been helpful in making our plans. A little less than 300 responses were received, and that is a very good return, for which I am grateful. Unless there is a new "shutdown" or "stay at home" order issued by the authorities (which is possible, given the worrisome increase in COVID-19 cases) it would be our intention to have the full Christmas Eve / Christmas Day Mass schedule as follows:

Christmas Eve

4:00 p.m. Church

6:00 p.m.

10:00 p.m.

Christmas Day

9:00 a.m.

11:00 a.m.

A second Mass to take place in the gym will be planned for 4:00 p.m. Christmas Eve. It is possible, but not likely, that other Masses may be scheduled in the gym if there is a reason to do so. **Most importantly, "in-person" attendance at all Masses scheduled on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day will be by reservation only.**

Under the current safety protocols and social distancing requirements, there will be at most 300 people permitted to attend Mass in the church, and at most 250 permitted in the Gym. This depends on our ability to seat larger family groups (6 to 10 persons living in the same household) together in one pew. In the coming weeks, we will be announcing the procedure for making reservations and obtaining the necessary entrance ticket that will be needed for every participant to enter the church (or

gym) and be seated. There will be a deadline for making reservations, and they will be available on a "first-come, first-served" basis. Right now, we are planning to open the "box office" on December 1st.

We are also planning to "live stream" all of our Christmas Masses and services throughout the Octave of Christmas. I really want to encourage everyone to consider this option, especially given the increasing threat of COVID-19 illness. To encourage and enhance meaningful participation via live stream, a special worship aid booklet is being prepared, which will cover all the Masses of Christmas and the Octave, including the Feast of the Holy Family, and the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God. We plan to make it available electronically on our website, as well as printed "hard copies" for use in church or at home. Individuals who receive a copy of the booklet when they attend Mass "in person" would be expected to keep the booklet and use it throughout the octave.

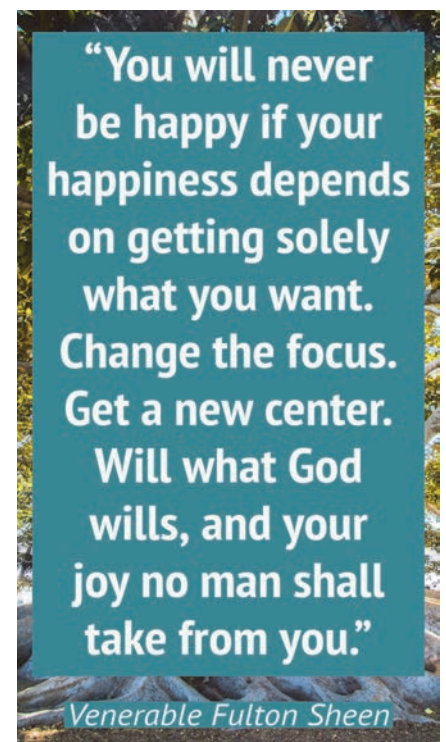
Christmas is a time when our traditions are very important. Many of us hold the keeping of Christmas traditions very dear and precious. One of those cherished traditions is coming to Church for Mass together as a family on Christmas Eve or Christmas Day. This year, the year of Our Lord 2020, is different. There is something more important than keeping our traditions--namely, keeping safe, keeping healthy. The Coronavirus pandemic has wreaked havoc on so much--our jobs, our economy, our schooling, our travel and vacation plans, our social interactions, and our family gatherings. It should be no surprise that our Christmas traditions will also be spoiled. For this reason, I want to urge all of you to set aside your expectations of keeping your Christmas traditions as usual, this year, especially the tradition of attending Christmas Mass "in person." We will not be keeping our usual traditions in the manner in which our Christmas Masses will be celebrated at St. Andrew. There will be no pageantry or solemn ceremony. Instead, there will be simplicity and social distancing.

So, in this year 2020, I want to strongly suggest that we set aside our traditions--just for this year-- and do things differently. Please put your safety and that of your family first. Consider the possibility of partaking in Christmas Mass from the safety of your home, via live stream.

Or, alternatively, consider celebrating Christmas in person at Mass on one of the other days within the Octave of Christmas, such as on the **Feast of the Holy Family (December 27)** or the **Solemnity of Mary (January 1)**. Whatever you decide and however you choose to celebrate Christmas this year, please choose carefully, based on the criteria of safety rather than sentimentality. I do remind you that all Catholics are dispensed from the obligation of attending Mass this Christmas, for good reason. Please do not hesitate to take advantage of this dispensation.

Please "stay tuned" for more information about our plans for celebrating Christmas at St. Andrew in the days and weeks ahead.

THOUGHTS FOR OUR PARISH CHILDREN

by "Jackie," Fr. Ferguson's Cat

Hi boys and girls! My name is "Jackie", and as you know, I am Father Ferguson's cat!

I am sorry that I didn't say anything to you last weekend! Father Ferguson forgot to wake me up, and, well, I overslept! We cats sleep a lot. Father thinks I sleep ALL the time, but he doesn't know that a lot of times, I am sitting there on the windowsill with my eyes closed not because I am sleeping, but because I am doing a special kind of prayer called "contemplation"! Children's Liturgy of the Word 2020

This week's Gospel: Matthew 25: 14-30

In this week's Gospel, Jesus tells the Parable of the Talents. A master gives talents, or gifts, to three servants. Each servant decides how to use the talents. Two of them share their talents and they multiply. One buries his talent to keep it safe.

God gives us talents. Just like the servants, our talents are unique. We don't have the exact same talents as anyone else. Some of us are gifted in reading or math. Some of us play sports well. Some of us excel at music or art. Still others listen well and show compassion for others.

So, what should we do with our talents? Should we hide them or should we share them with others? God gave us our talents to share with others and help bring the Kingdom of God. For example, if you read well, you can become a lector at church. If you love music, you can join the choir. If you enjoy helping people, you can volunteer with a charity. Your challenge this week is to think about the talents God gave you. How can you use your talents to serve in God's Kingdom?

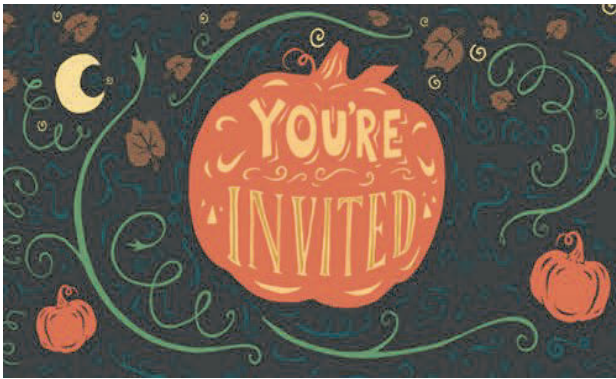

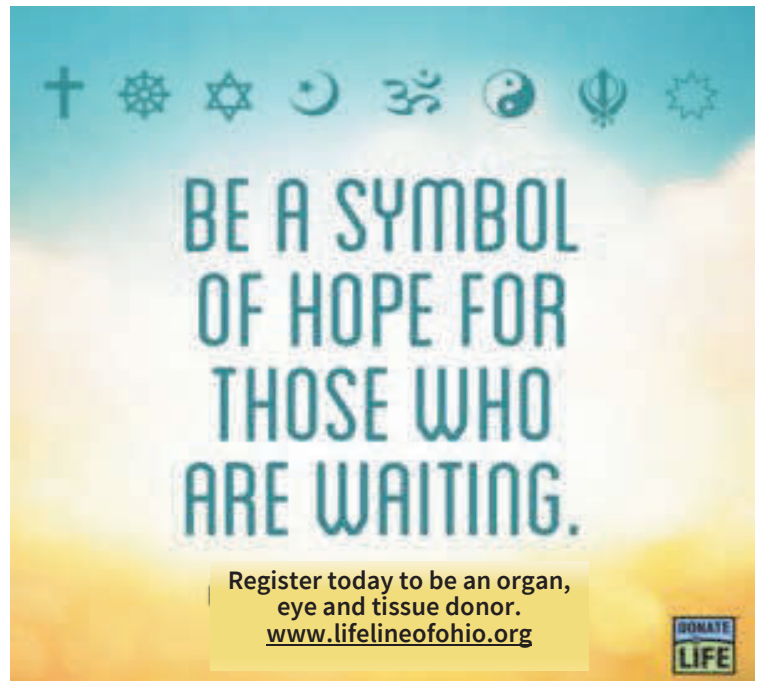

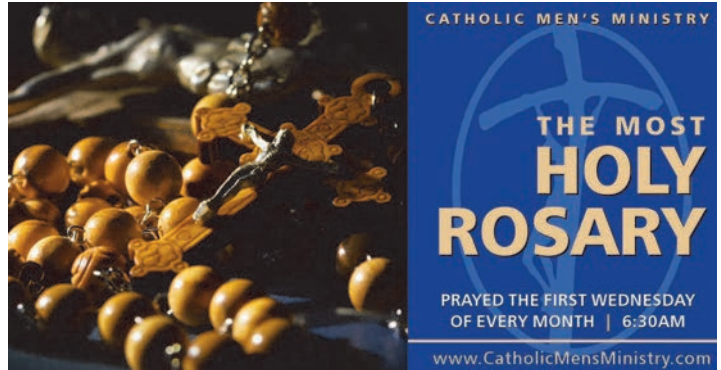
This is the fourth year for this Mass; previous years have been very special and well-attended.

WHY DO WE DO THAT?

Catholic Life Explained:

Question:

The Bible says that Jesus condemned gambling, but I notice that so many parishes have gambling at festivals and other events. What's correct?

Answer:

Although Jesus speaks of our relationship with material wealth and the very human struggle with greed, the gospels do not include any specific instructions related to gambling. At the same time, the Church is very sensitive to the needs of those who might struggle with an addiction to gambling, and pastoral care should always be offered to those who struggle with this reality in their life.

While it is true that many parish or school communities include gambling or games of chance in festivals and fundraisers (e.g. bingo, roulette, ring tossing, dunking booths, etc.), there is nothing inherently wrong with these sorts of events. Given they are played fairly and within the limits of reason, they are not morally objectionable. As the Catechism of the Catholic Church reminds us: "Games of chance (card games, etc.) or wagers are not in themselves contrary to justice. They become morally unacceptable when they deprive someone of what is necessary to provide for his needs and those of others" (no. 2413).

As in all things, moderation and a sense of healthy limits should be applied to gambling and games of chance. For those who find themselves living with addiction to gambling, help is available in various 12-step and addiction recovery programs.
