LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners: Today we begin a new ecclesiastical and liturgical year. Today we celebrate the First Sunday of Advent. Advent, as you all know, is the season in which we prepare to celebrate Christmas, the solemnity of the birth of our Savior, Jesus Christ. We prepare in these weeks before Christmas in a spirit of prayer and penance. The penance of Advent has its own special quality – it is expressed through patience and waiting. This patience and waiting is meant to recall the many centuries God's people waited for the coming of the promised Messiah. It is meant to sharpen our anticipation and increase our readiness to welcome Christ when He comes again in glory to judge the living and the dead. It is meant to increase our appreciation that Jesus, born of Mary in Bethlehem, is truly the Word made flesh, the longed-for Messiah, who has come already and even now dwells among us. We keep Advent, therefore, in patience and waiting.

This year, we will need a lot of patience, as Advent coincides with a very serious surge in the Coronavirus pandemic. This year, we will have to wait even longer for it all to end, and we have already been waiting for many months now. Like the people of old who waited through many dark years for the coming of the promised One, so we wait through many dark times for the coming of the promised vaccine. But let us continue to abide in patience and in waiting. In this season of Advent, let us offer to God our frustration, anxiety and impatience, and ask Him to give us peace, serenity and patience. With the help of this divine assistance, we will be equipped to continue all of our efforts to prevent the spread of the Coronavirus, to keep ourselves and our loved ones safe, to cooperate with the curfew order and the "stay at home" advisory, and to do all of this with utmost patience.

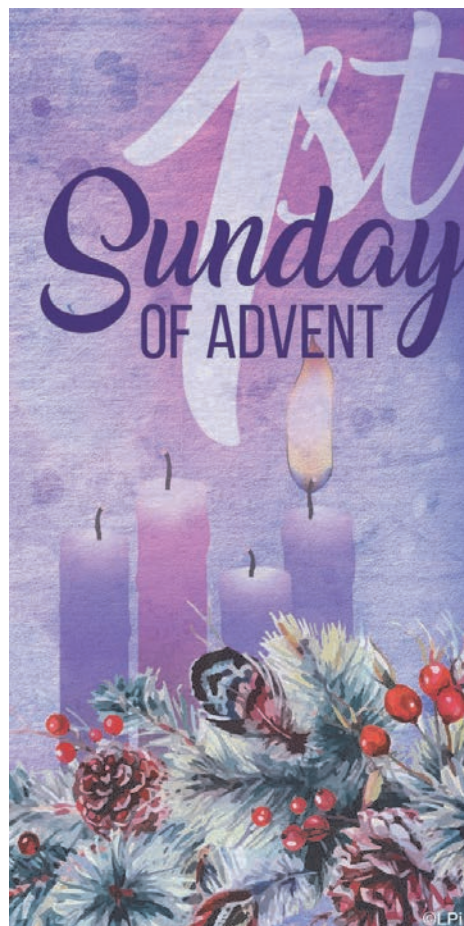
Two weeks ago, I shared with you our plans for the celebration of Christmas Masses here at St. Andrew's this year, and noted that all Christmas Eve and Christmas Day Masses will require reservations for in person attendance. The details and link to the reservation software are currently being assembled and tested and will be available on our Parish website soon. Emails will also be sent to households who currently receive the Parish e-post.

If you do not currently receive the e-post, contact Mary Beasecker at mbeasecker@standrewparish.cc. While St. Andrew still plans for in-person attendance at the Christmas Masses, the very serious surge in COVID-19 cases makes it difficult to know exactly what conditions may prevail at Christmas. There is a "stay at home" advisory currently in effect in Franklin County. This means you should consider very carefully the decision whether or not to

attend Mass in-person at the present time. Please consider joining our Sunday Mass via livestream as an alternative. Although St. Andrew Parish is continuing to offer Masses as usual, you should stay alert for any change. Please watch this bulletin or check our parish website for up-to-date information. Most of all, please be careful, please be safe, and please be patient this Advent.

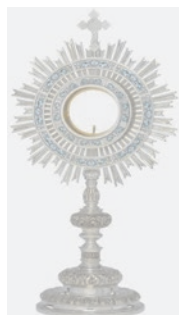

CHILDREN'S LITURGY

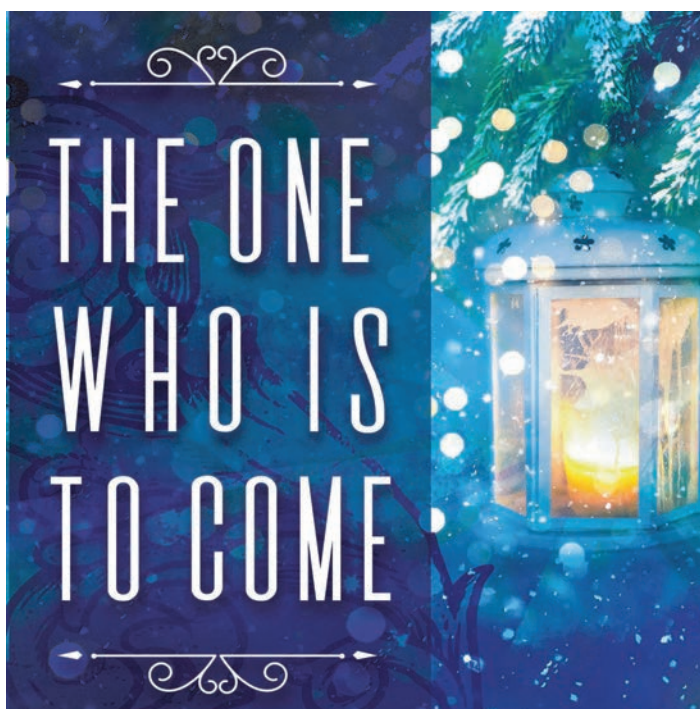
Today's Gospel: Mark 13:33-37

Jesus tells us to watch and be alert! He will come but we don't know when.

Today is the first Sunday of Advent. Thanksgiving has passed and it seems that everyone focuses on Christmas. But we have four weeks until the celebration of Jesus' birth. Now is a time to watch and prepare. The church building will change over this season. The decorations and colors will change. The weather will continue to get colder and we'll spend more time indoors. Our houses will change as well. Our families will put up decorations.

One thing you'll see is the Advent Wreath. The wreath holds 4 candles: 3 purple and 1 rose. This week we'll light the first candle. It stands for hope. We have hope that Jesus will come again, and the Kingdom of God will be fulfilled. As we light more candles each week, we remember that Jesus is the Light of the World.

You'll also see purple. Purple is the color we see during Advent and Lent. It reminds us to prepare (and that doesn't mean to buy presents). We prepare by praying and doing penance. If you're old enough, you should try to go to Confession. You can also read about Jesus in the Bible. Do something kind for others. Now would be the time to do one of the Corporal Works of Mercy. We talked about those last week.

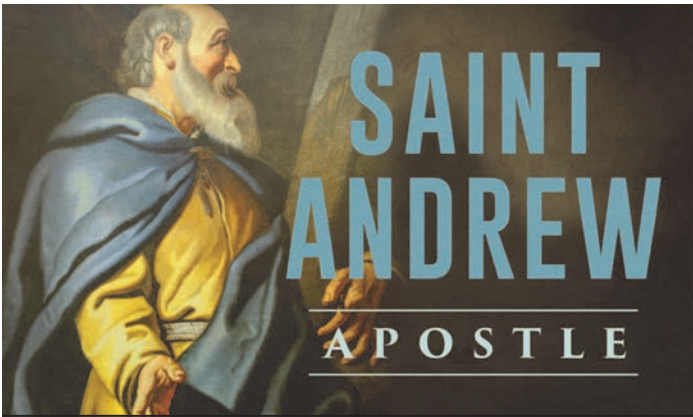

FORMATION IN THE WAITING

Reflection on Mark 13:33-37

Very few people throw a relationship with God into the trash basket all at once or even quickly. We sort of slide out of it. It doesn't get vaporized in an instant; it evaporates little by little. If I grow gradually inattentive to God at the center of my life, then I'll begin to think more and more that the world would be a much better place if everyone would just take care of my needs. I'm now at the center of the universe, and that is the worst kind of rigidity. The seeds of love, of beauty, of goodness grow with great difficulty in soil so toxic. Or, to change the image to that of the prophet Isaiah's God, the potter works overtime to shape a clay that is so hardened into something beautiful.

As we begin this Advent season, we are told in today's Gospel to be attentive to God. Be watchful for His coming. Be open and malleable to the touch of God's hands that will continuously shape us into His lovers. In a seamless transition from the last liturgical year to this new one, we are invited into this Advent time of waiting and watching.

We do not wait in an idle or passive manner, but like the servants in the Gospel, we anticipate our master's return by assuming responsibility for the work of the household. Today, you and I are responsible for God's household, for the natural world in which we live and for the new world of grace given us in Christ. And so our waiting and watching involve active service of God's Kingdom, knowing that if we let Him, God can fashion each of us into something spectacular. May we be that kind of clay in the hands of the Potter.

ST. FRANCIS XAVIER

Feast Day: December 3 • Patron Saint of Missionaries



Francis Xavier was a priest from Javier, Spanish Navarre, who became the first Jesuit missionary. While waiting in India for his ship to take him on his conversion missions, he preached along the streets of Goa and taught children their catechism and eventually converted the whole city. He baptised more than forty thousand people in India, the East Indies and Japan, and endured horrific conditions on his journeys. He traveled barefoot and performed miracles as he healed and helped the sick and forgotten along the way. He died of a fever in China while on a mission journey.
