LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners:

This Sunday, the Third Sunday of Advent, is known as "Gaudete" Sunday. "Gaudete" means "Rejoice!" The reason for our rejoicing is that the season of Advent is half over, and the feast of Christmas is drawing nearer. I think many of us, including me, are more inclined to panic--because we realize that Christmas is less than two weeks away, and our preparations are nowhere near complete! Advent is a time of preparation, but we don't feel very prepared at this point.

We are busy preparing for the celebration of Christmas here at St. Andrew Parish. The reservation of places for in-person attendance at our Christmas Masses is well underway and is in fact wrapping up soon. We are planning to live-stream our Masses on Christmas and during the octave so people may safely participate in our services from home. And we have prepared a worship aid booklet for all of our Masses from Christmas Eve through January 1st. The booklet also contains texts for Vespers (Evening Prayer) for the weekdays during the Octave. We plan to have this booklet available online to enhance your participation in our live-streamed Masses and services. It will also be available as a hard copy to those attending Mass on Christmas and during the octave. Those who receive and use a hard copy of the booklet at church should keep it and use the same booklet for any subsequent Masses or services they may attend through the week.

We still have much to do to be prepared for Christmas, but we are making progress! May you experience peace and contentment in these waning days of Advent, and may you be safe and healthy.



THOUGHTS FOR OUR PARISH CHILDREN


by "Jackie," Fr. Ferguson's Cat

This is a joyful time of year, since Christmas is all about when Jesus was born into this world. And in fact, every year, the Third Sunday of Advent has a special name: it is called "Gaudete Sunday"! "Gaudete" is a word from the Latin language that means, "Take joy!" That's right! And you know, one of the reasons why Christmas brings us joy is that Jesus' birth – God taking on a human body – tells us that our bodies are pretty special! If God was willing to enter a body, then your body is meant to be a holy part of who you are, too!

After all, someday we hope to be in Heaven, and at the end of time, we will have our body with us forever in Heaven! God created your body as a pretty amazing part of being a human. Today is the third Sunday of Advent. We light the third candle of the Advent wreath, which is a rose color, as we wait for Jesus.

Today's Gospel reading is about John the Baptist. You have already heard of him in another Gospel reading. God had sent His messenger, John to tell about the light—Jesus. John himself was not the light.

But many people asked him if he was the Messiah, Jesus. And John said, "No I am not. He is coming after me, but I am not good enough even to untie his sandals."

Then, the people said to him, "Who are you?" John replied,

"I am the voice of someone shouting in the desert: Make a straight path for the Lord to travel."

We are all supposed to help make the path for Jesus straight. Think about this. How can we do this? How should we treat others to help make the path straight? How should we treat people who hurt us to make the path straight? What does the Second Great Commandment say about this? The Ten Commandments give us a guide.

THE SEASON OF HOPE

FOSTERING HOPE BY SEEKING DIRECT SERVICE

ERIN CORDLE, DIOCESAN HOPE TASK FORCE

During Advent, we are reminded of a voice “calling in the wilderness prepare the way of the LORD!” (Isaiah 40:3) Isaiah 40 can be an alarm clock after the rhythm of Ordinary Time to wake us up. It can be a jolt awakening – a middle of the night crash that makes us sit up in bed and look around. It might scare us a little, maybe even make us gasp, but it definitely makes us notice our surroundings. Advent entices all of our senses because the Spirit is moving and preparing the way of the Lord.

Isaiah 40 references the Israelites in exile in Babylonia. The people are desperately hoping for a joyful return to their homeland – to a more normal life again. Amidst their burnout and fatigue, they hear God who comforts them with the promise of liberation and restoration. Many of us also are experiencing burnout, fatigue, pain, or suffering. Much like those exiled in Babylonia, we may feel like giving up as we may not realize how close hope is.

I find it no coincidence that Advent follows busy seasons for many of us: the start of a new school year, the election season, Thanksgiving, fall sports, and numerous other time commitments – even in this COVID-19 environment. We haven’t been wandering around aimlessly during Ordinary Time, but we may have settled into more ordinary routines. Advent lets us look around and have opportunities to hear God as we approach the birth of Jesus. There are sacred and powerful reminders of God’s comfort all around us during Advent – all we need to do is lean in and watch. Hope and help is closer than it seems to be.


