

MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners:

The other night, I took my dog, Mabel, outside shortly before bedtime. I looked up at the sky and saw the moon, which wasn't very bright and had a brownish tint to it. At first, I thought this might be due to the haze, but then I decided it was probably due to smoke from the western wildfires in our atmosphere. I began to think about this and it made me realize that even far-away events have a real effect on us right where we live. Because the Earth is one planet, natural disasters and man-made disasters have far-reaching effects. As I looked at the tinted moon, I interpreted it as a sign, a reminder that God entrusted the earth to the care of human beings.

As we pray to God in the words of the Mass of Eucharistic Prayer IV: "You formed man in your own image and entrusted the whole world to his care." The earth is our "common home," not only of humans, but of all God's creatures. Just because a disaster does not occur in our immediate area, we are still all affected by it. So I should care about it too, and take some responsibility for it also.

I share this with you in the hope that you may find it meaningful as I did. Let us all be aware of our shared responsibility for the earth, and do our part to protect and conserve what God has entrusted to our care.




