

MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners:

This weekend we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King – the last Sunday of the church's liturgical year. May Christ truly reign over us, may He rule our hearts; may His Kingdom come, and may he destroy every sovereignty and power that is opposed to His gentle but powerful rule! Jesus our Lord and King has said, "Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will never pass away." The rulers of this world, the powerful and mighty, are all destined to pass away, but Christ's rule will endure forever. So let us serve him first and foremost.

Monday, Nov. 22, is the feast day of St. Cecilia, the patron saint of musicians, especially church musicians such as organists. St. Cecilia was a martyr who died in Rome in the third century, and her name is mentioned in the first Eucharistic prayer of the Mass (the Roman Canon). There is no evidence that St. Cecilia ever played the organ, but she is usually depicted as doing so in sacred art.

St. Cecilia is one of my favorite saints for a couple of reasons. St. Cecilia Church in Oakley (Cincinnati) was my mother's home parish, and I remember going there with my grandmother and my uncles when I was a young child. And I am also an amateur organist and consider my music-making a form of prayer and spirituality. Cecilia "sang to the Lord in her heart," and so that's what I try to do when I play music, especially sacred music. The Organ is the instrument that best proclaims the glory and majesty of God. St. Andrew Parish is fortunate to have the beautiful and stately Austin pipe organ which supports our worship of God and accompanies our sacred Psalms, hymns, and inspired songs. And we are also blessed to have Mr. Phil Lortz – a talented and gifted director of music and organist – play the organ and to lead all of the music-makers at St. Andrew Church. May St. Cecilia help us all to sing God's praises!

I do wish all of you a blessed and happy Thanksgiving! May we be truly thankful for all of God's many gifts and His tender care for all of us.

As part of the Christmas collection, parishioners have been asked to contribute in two ways:


1. Share your empty shoeboxes (or any box the size of a shoebox). Ultimately, the boxes will be filled with a variety of items for the kids for Christmas.

St. Andrew was a fisherman and the first apostle called by Jesus. Like St. Andrew, we are all called to be fishers of men.





